## Clarendon to Celebrate

The Oldest July Fourth Celebration in the Panhandle will get under way Saturday in Clarendon July 1st with the first of four Rodeo Performances slated for 8 p. m. Other performances will be held the night of July 3rd, afternoon and night of July 4th. Another record breaking entry list of contestants is expected with approximately \$3,500 prize money to go to the winners along with two saddles, belt buckles, etc. Performances will be held at 8 p. m. Saturday, Monday and Tuesday and 2 p. m. the afternoon of the Fourth.

Six thousand pounds of dressed beef has been donated by local ranchers and individuals for the big free barbecue at noon July 4th. The barbecuing and cooking crew will begin their task the morning of July 3rd.

A western parade will be featured at 1 p. m., July 4th; an old settlers reunion at 9 a. m. and an old Fiddlers contest at 4 p. m.

## Greenbelt Dam

Ross Springer, Hedley director of the Greenbelt Water Authority, attended a meeting of the board of directors of the Authority at Childress last Thursday night.

A preliminary feasibility report from the engineers indicates that the most recent site which has been core drilled will be suitable for a dam.

Eight core tests were made at the new site, which is known as the little gyp site. It is located about 1½ miles east of the Donley-Collingsworth County line.

Altogether something over \$50,000.00 has been spent by the cities, state and federal government in the development of the Greenbelt Municipal and Industrial Authority.

Largest amounts were around \$30,000.00 for mapping, \$10,000.00 for water sampling and \$8,000.00 for core drilling. This has run over a period of five and one half years. A long time and a lot of hard work.

A final report on the site and the feasibility of the project is expected in some thirty days. Then the Authority may be able to make much faster progress on this great project.
