The chute gates for the 17th annual Top o' Texas Rodeo at Pampa will swing open Monday, Aug. 7th with the Kid Pony Show scheduled for that afternoon and night.

The Rodeo proper will begin Tuesday night, August 8th at 8:00 p. m. preceded by a giant street parade at 3:00 led by the Amarillo Air Force Band under the direction of Capt. E. S. Bridges. Other bands appearing in the parade line-up will be the Pampa High School Band under the direction of Bill Tregoe and the Miller Bros. Western Dance Band of Wichita Falls. Bill Tidwell, Parade Marshal, has issued an invitation to the Riding Clubs, Ranch entries, Civic Club entries, and Commercial Divisions to place entries in the parade which will form on West Foster Street at 2:15.

Prizes totaling more than \$5,000 supplemented with many handsome trophies will go to winners in the representative events, plus a special prize going to the Best All Around Cowboy. To be eligible for this prize a cowboy must be entered in three major rodeo events. This year there will be two go rounds and a Finals in each main rodeo event. The top cowboys in each event will ride in the Finals on Saturday night, August 12.

An American Quarter Horse Show is scheduled for Thursday and Friday, August 10 and 11 with a record number of horses from the Southwest expected to be entered.

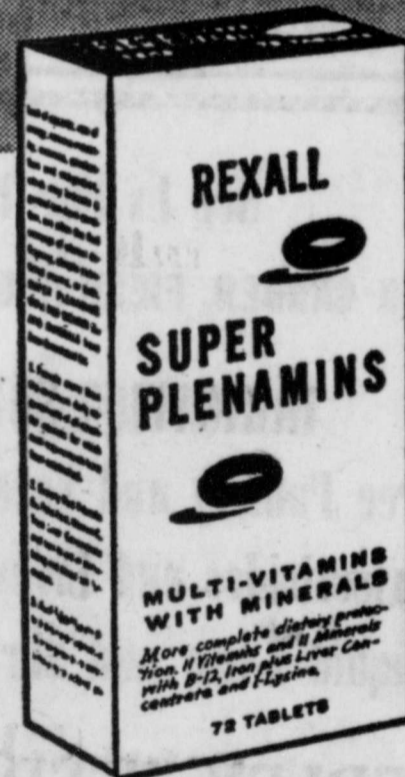
