Hedley Schools To Open August 18

Enrollment for all grades will begin at 9:00 a. m. Friday morning, Aug 18. There will be a general assembly program for all students in the high school auditorium. Teachers will be introduced and general requirements will be explained at this time. A short program will be presented, after which enrollment will begin.

Elementary grades will report to their home rooms in the elementary building. High school students will remain in the auditorium for additional instructions. High school students will report to the following rooms:

After receiving instructions and reading suggested Course of Study and list of subjects offered, the student will make out his program card, have it approved by the room advisor, take it to the library where it will be checked by Mr. White. You will be assigned a locker at this time.

Buses will run according to last year's schedule unless there are additional requests for transportation. Persons who have moved into the district since last year are requested to make application at the school office for transportation.

Lunch will be served in the cafeteria beginning Friday, Aug. 18. Prices will be the same as last year. Elementary students, grades one through six, will pay 30c per lunch. Grades seven through twelve will pay 35c. Extra milk with lunches will be 6c per $\frac{1}{2}$ pint. Free lunches are provided those students whose parents are unable to afford lunch for their children. They are reminded, however, that they must make application for free lunches at the school office. No lunches will be approved until this is done.

The County Fair will be on both

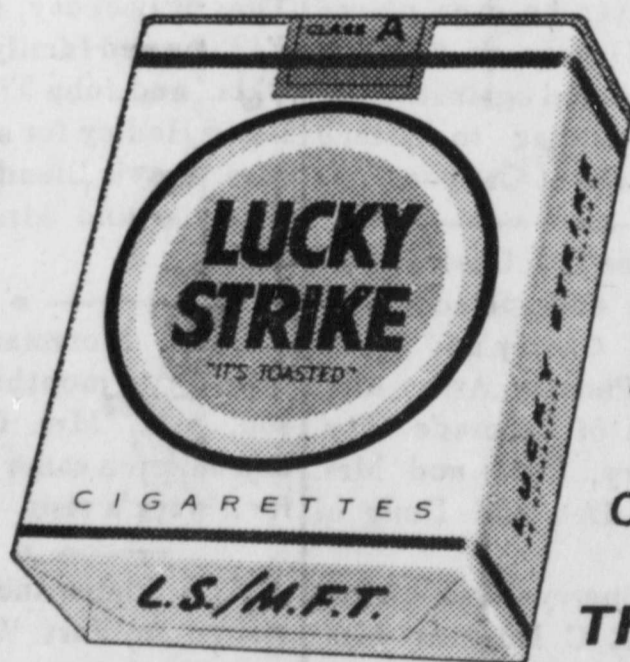
