Texaco Tanker Offered

The Miller Texaco Station is making a special offer to its customers in the shape of a model of the Texaco tanker North Dakota for \$3.98 with the purchase of eight gallons or more of gasoline.

The real North Dakota is 565 feet long, 75 feet wide, 19,203 deadweight tons and can attain a speed of 20 knots. Her capacity is over 6 million gallons and she has a crew of 49. Her regular runs from Texaco's largest refinery at Port Arthur, Texas, to Providence, Rhode Island a five day trip of 1,985 miles.

Today Texaco has 91 tankers in its worldwide fleet with a total carrying capacity of 2,315,000 deadweight tons, and between now and the end of 1962 will place six more new tankers in service. In the course of a year the present fleet could haul enough gasoline to keep every car, truck, bus and tractor in the United States operating for a full year.
