Greenbelt Dam

In a meeting at Childress Tuesday night of last week, a report was given by the engineers of the Greenbelt Dam project on the progress being made. About 25 or 30 persons from Hedley were among the 175 who attended the meeting.

The report stated that the proposed dam above the gyp beds of the Salt Fork would provide an ample supply of water for at least 50 years, and that the project was the last possible adequate supply of good water in the entire area. The dam and reservoir, which would impound 93,000 acre feet of water, would cost \$4,176,000. One treatment plant to be built at the dam site will cost \$1,257,890. The distribution system to serve seven towns, Childress, Quanah, Paducah, Wellington, Memphis, Hedley and Clarendon will cost \$8,819,000.

It was stated that it would be approximately four years before the project could be built after being voted by the people.

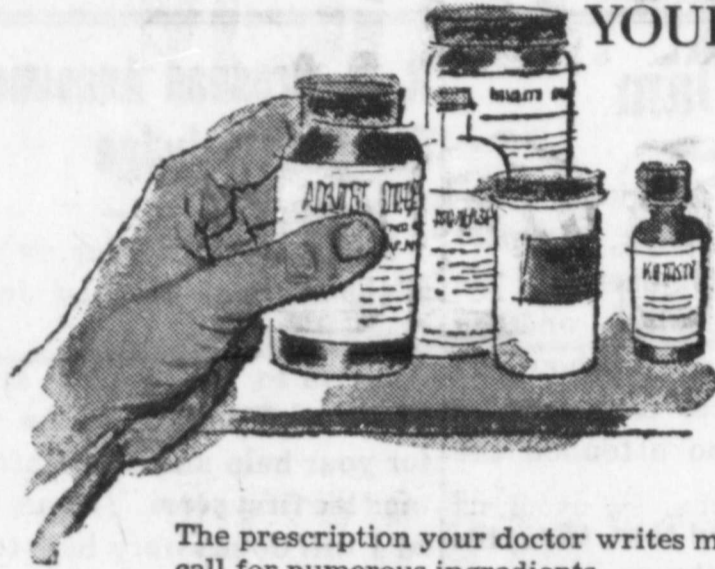

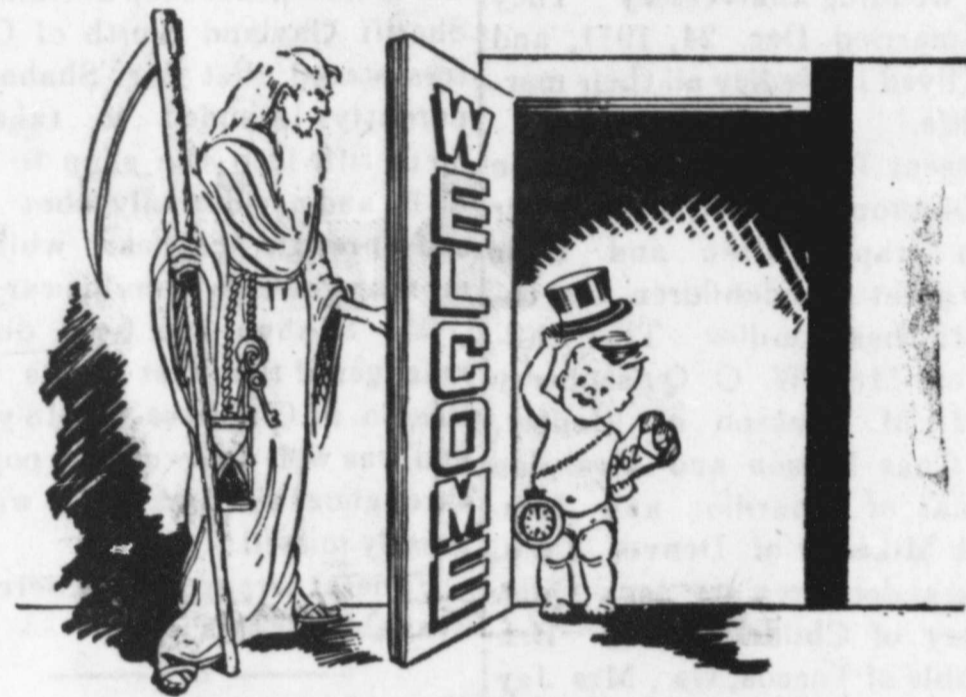
