
Dr Ludwig said that another 55,000 Nazarenes in foreign lands gave the church a total world membership of 382,000.



1 Farm income is up 1 billion dollars; and

2 It brought about the first cut in over supplies in 9 years. A drop in the carryover is certain, maybe about 51 million tons.

3 A 500 million dollar savings. over several years, in storage and handling costs, compared with what those costs would have been without the program. Largest costs to the Government are the storing, shipping, handling, etc., of grain the Government takes over. So the grain not taken over this year will result in a saving.




