WTU Lines Damaged

Severe winds accompanied by snow played havoc with the West Texas Utilities Company lines west of Quanah to Childress and north of Childress last Friday morning.

A high line pole four miles southeast of Clarendon was snapped by the wind causing damage to the 69,000 volt line between Clarendon and Memphis. Three high line poles between Childress and Quanah succumbed to the severe wind in that area and broke another 69,000 volt line linking the two cities. A second line of the same voltage was also in service but once again the weather showed its might and that line, too, was put out of service.

J. C. Randel, WTU District Manager at Childress, was quoted as saying, "Despite the handicap of adverse weather conditions, our crews restored the damaged lines to active service in short order. I am proud of them."
