Each eligible child on the census means approximately \$65 per year to the school district.

Teachers Had a Rough Time in 1842

Mrs. C. L. Johnson called our attention to the following, which appeared recently in The Matador Tribune:

These rules for teachers were posted by a New York City principal in 1842:

1. Teachers each day will fill lamps, clean chimneys, and trim wicks.

2. Each teacher will bring a bucket of water and a scuttle of coal for the day's session.

3. Make your pens carefully. You may whittle nibs to the individual taste of the pupil.

4. Men teachers may take one evening each week for courting purposes, or two evenings a week if they go to church regularly.

5. After ten hours in school the teachers spend the remaining hours reading the Bible or other good books.

6. Women teachers who marry or engage in unseemly conduct will be dismissed.

7. Every teacher should lay aside from each pay a goodly sum of his earnings for his benefit during his declining years so that he will not become a burden on society.

8. Any teacher who smokes, uses liquor in any form frequents pool or public halls, or gets shaved in a barber shop will give good reason to suspect his worth, intentions, integrity and honesty.

9. The teacher who performs his labors faithfully and without fault for five years will be given an increase of twenty five cents per week in his pay providing the Board of Education approves.

Pre-measurement For 1962 Cotton Applications for pre-measurement of 1962 cotton allotments are being taken. The cost of pre-measuring has been set at 10¢ per allotment acre, 9¢ per mile round trip to the farm, 15¢ per stake used in staking off the measured acres, \$8.50 for first plot and \$3.00 for each additional plot. The final date for applying for pre-measurement is March 30, 1962.

Deadline Nears For Loans And Purchase Agreements

January 31 will be the deadline for loans and purchase agreements on commodities harvested. Farmers in the county who produce barley, grain sorghum, rye, wheat etc. should be alerted to this final date to obtain price support on these commodities.

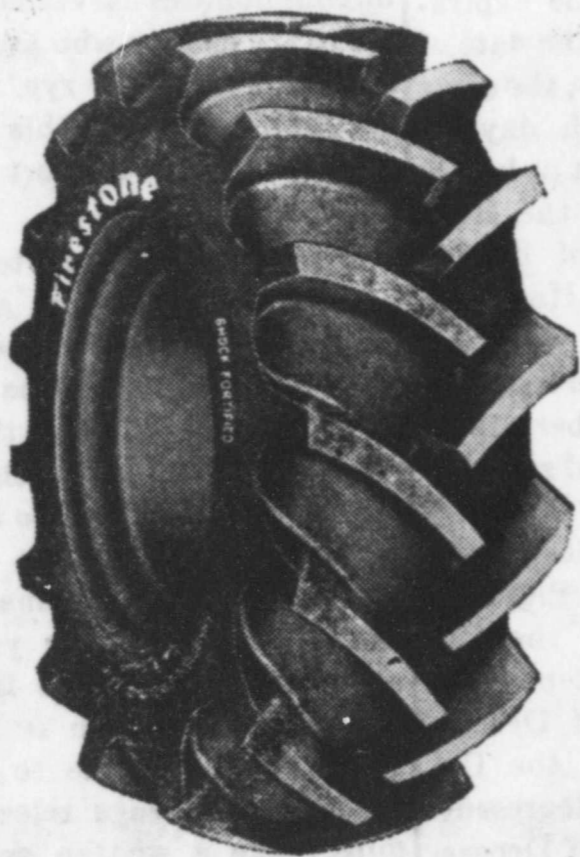

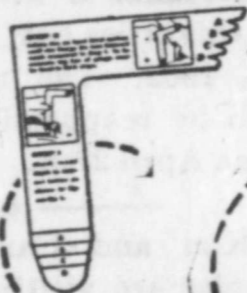

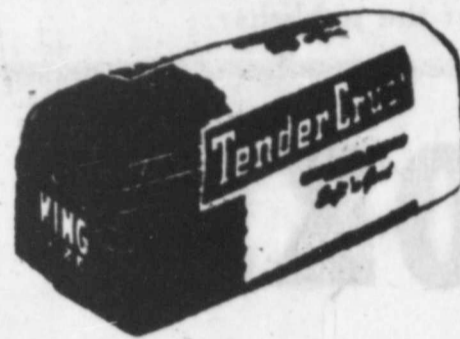
