The many friends of the family were deeply shocked and grieved to learn of the death of Mrs. J. S. Hinds of Silverton, who passed away Friday afternoon in St. Anthony's Hospital in Amarillo. Mrs. Hinds had undergone an operation there, but was thought to be improving.

Funeral services were held Sunday afternoon in the Silverton Methodist Church by the pastor, Rev. Marvin Fisher, and Haun Kite, Silverton Church of Christ minister. Graveside services and burial were at Rowe cemetery here.

Mrs. Hinds, the former Frances Kendall, was born at Clarendon Feb. 9, 1909. She moved to Hedley with her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Frank Kendall, when quite small, and grew up here. After graduating from Hedley High School and attending college, she adopted the teaching profession, and had had 27 years experience. She had taught the third grade in Silverton for the past two years, she and Mr. Hinds moving there from Hedley. Mr. Hinds is superintendent of schools at Silverton.

Mrs. Hinds taught school in Hedley for a number of years on two different occasions, and was always very active in church, school, and club work.

Mrs. Hinds was a member of the Silverton Methodist Church. She is survived by her husband; a daughter, Nancy Lou Hinds, a student at West Texas State College at Canyon; a sister, Mrs. Virginia Hinds of Abilene; two brothers, J. N. Kendall of Abilene and Lt. Col. Rex S. Kendall of Fort Hood; and her mother, Mrs. Frank Kendall, presently of Abilene. Her father Frank Kendall, passed away in 1960.

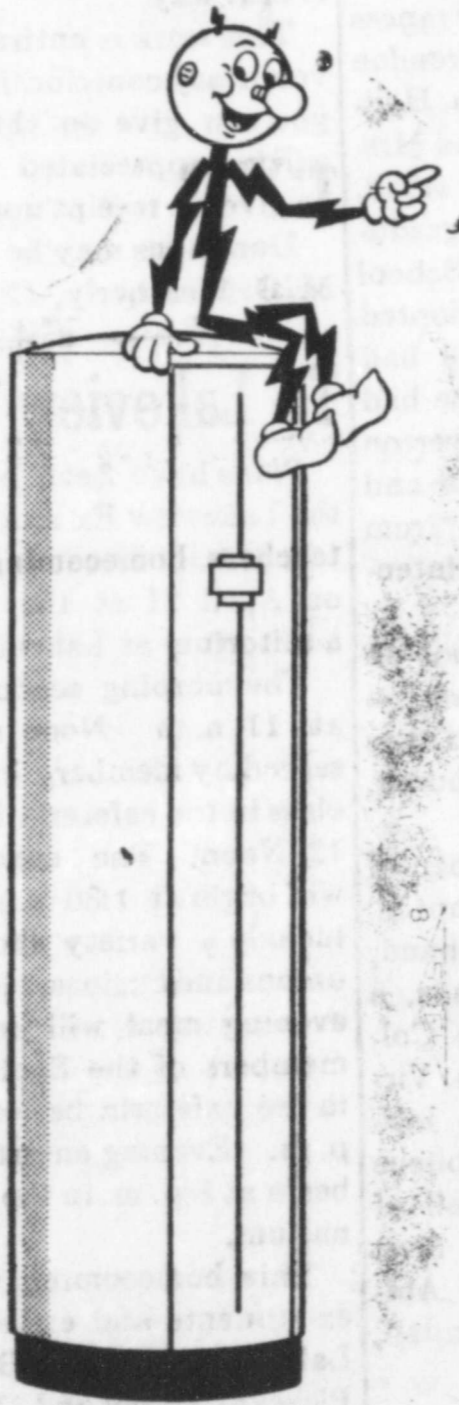

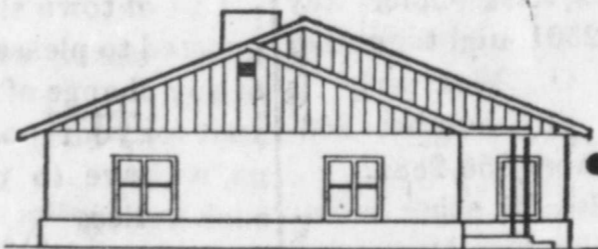

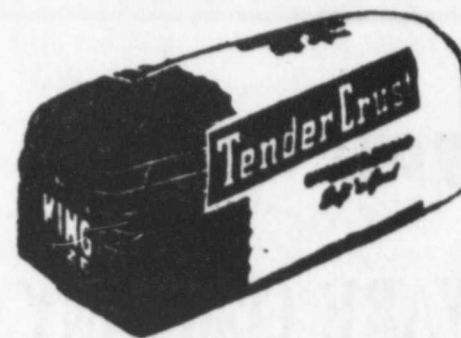
