





Now is the time for all cotton farmers to begin to watch their young cotton for thrips, fleahoppers and the possibility of boll weevils just beginning to move in from pastures into the young cotton. County agent Flip Breedlove says that regular checking of cotton fields can prevent a great deal of damage by insects before they get started Cotton spraying guides for all types of insecticides are available at the county agents office.
