## School To Open

School will begin on August 17, with the enrollment of all students on this day. Classes will begin on Monday, August 20. Buses will not run or lunches be served until Monday.

Enrollment will begin at 9:30 to 12:00 in the morning and 1:30 to 3:30 in the afternoon on Friday. Beginning students are reminded that they must present a birth certificate and it must remain on file in the superintendent's office. All children must be immunized against diphtheria, smallpox, whooping cough and polio. A doctor's certificate must be presented as proof of immunization.

Cafeteria prices will be the same as last year: grades 1 to 6, 30¢; grades 7 to 12, 35¢. No student will be placed on the free lunch program until an application has been made by his parents and approved by the school authorities.

Mr Mathews remains as assistant vice president, Mrs. Sue Weatherly as cashier, and Mrs. Geraldine Wiggins as bookkeeper. Don Cox and Bill Fietz are summer employees who will return to college this fall.

The new building for the bank is coming along nicely, and Mr. Anderson stated that it should be completed within the next 30 days, which will give Hedley very modern and attractive banking facilities. Mr. Anderson added that the bank expects to continue its present policies of operation.

Mr. Thorp, who is a brother of Mrs. Anderson, has spent most of his life in Ryan, having been in business there since the 1920's. He is presently operating theatres in Ryan and Waurika, Okla., and Burkburnett and Henrietta, Texas. He is also interested in real estate and cattle.

Clifford Johnson after selling his stock in the bank, resigned as a director and vice president, severing a connection begun many years ago. The bank wishes to express to him their thanks for his many years of faithful service.

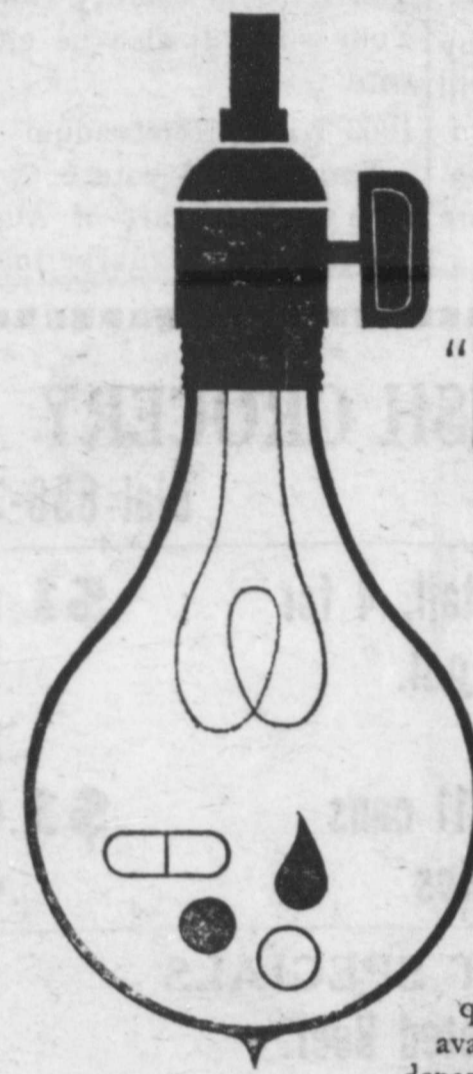

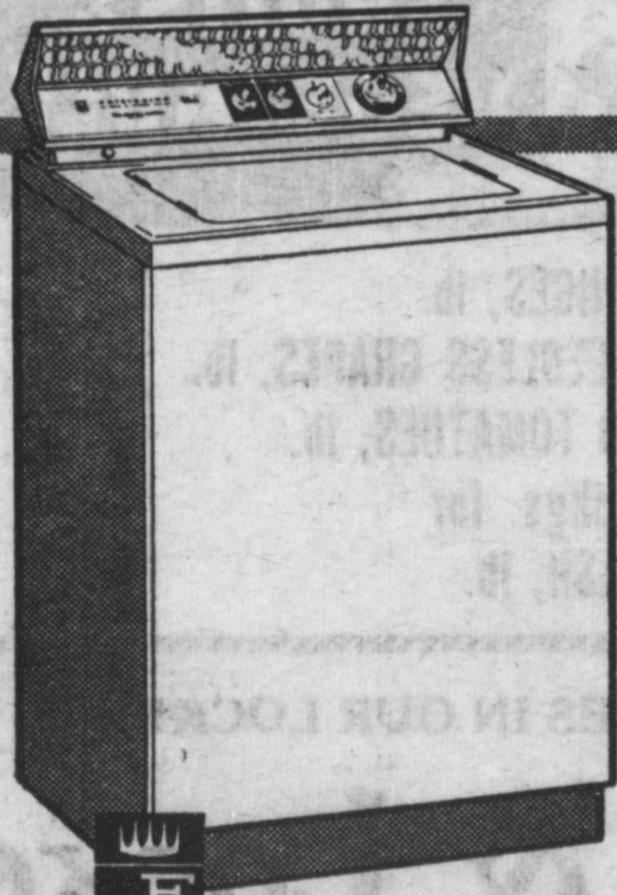

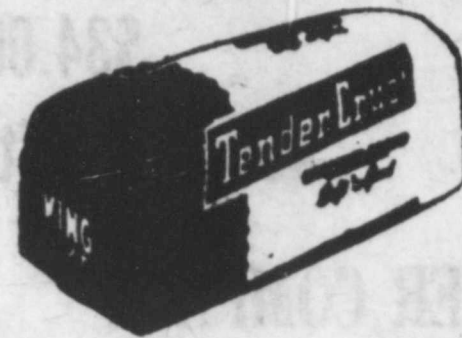
