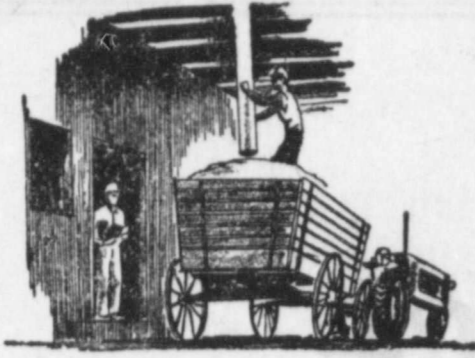

Farm Facts

World wheat production in 1961 amounted to an estimated 7,830 million bushels, according to the U.S. Department of Agriculture. Of this, the United States supplied almost 1,235 million, or more than 15% of the total.

Russia, with production estimated at 1,900 million bushels, accounted for about 24% of the total wheat output. Russia's wheat acreage, however, was an estimated 155 million, as compared with 51.6 million for the United States.

Yield per acre for the Russians amounted to 12.3 bushels, compared with 23.9 bushels for the United States. In per acre yields, however, several countries far outstripped both the United States and Russia.

The 1961 average for Denmark was 61.8 bushels. Wheat yields averaged 58.2 bushels per acre in The Netherlands and more than 50 bushels in Belgium and the United Kingdom.

In total wheat production,

The U.S. produces almost 1/6 of the World's wheat.



India ranked third with 398 million bushels, followed by France with 346.5 million, Italy with 305 million, and Canada with 261.7 million. Figures for Red China, a major wheat producing country, are not available.

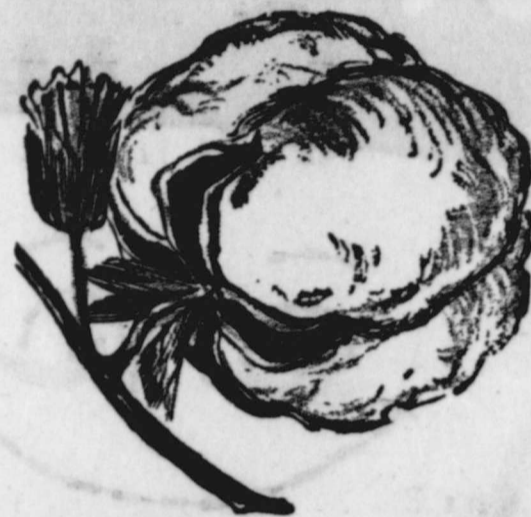

Greetings:

Cotton, which has played so vital a role in the development of Texas, remains one of the agricultural mainstays of its economy. Value of cotton produced in this State exceeds \$20 billion, and this crop's service to mankind is beyond measure.

Ten years ago, Hedley Cotton Festival was launched under joint sponsorship of the local Lions Club and Booster Club to celebrate and give thanks for the bountiful cotton crops produced in the area.

Residents of the entire Texas Panhandle are invited to Hedley for the two day Festival, climaxed by the coronation of the Queen of Cotton. Seven thousand persons have attended each of the ten previous Cotton Festivals in Hedley, a town of 500 population.

The Festival is the only one of its kind and is sanctioned by the National Cotton Council. Festival committees promote improvement of the soil and the growing of better grades of cotton.

In official recognition whereof, I hereby affix my signature this 28th day of Sept. 1962.

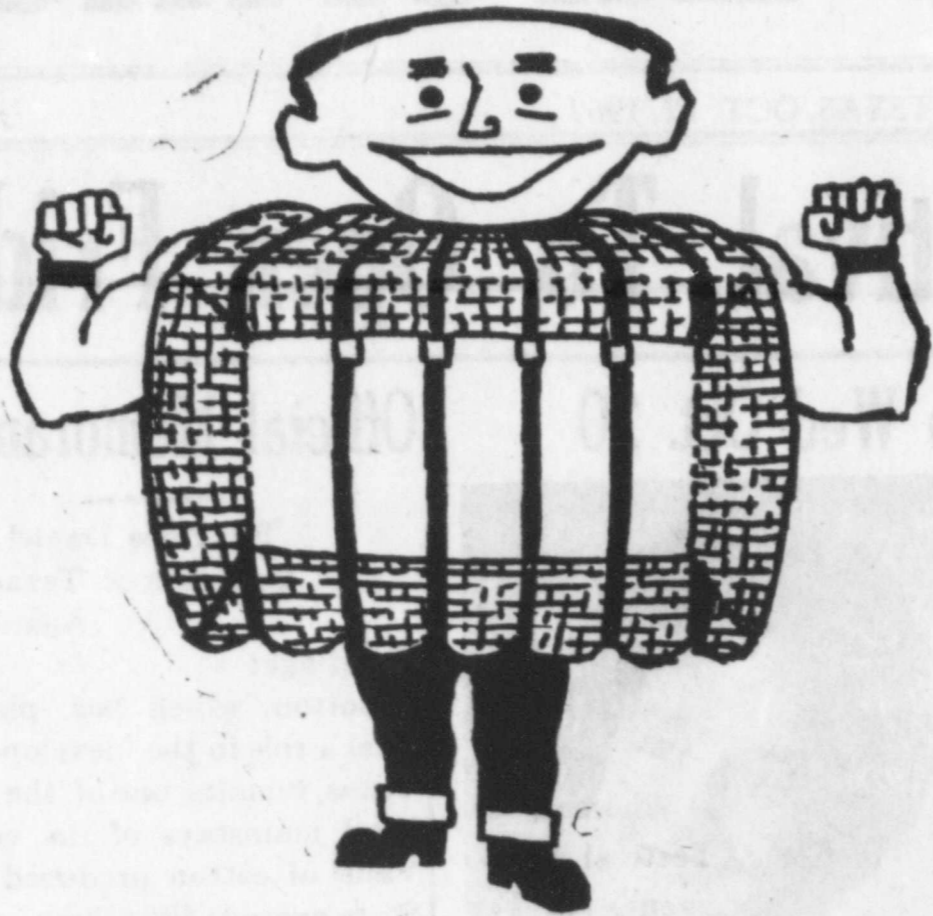
