Marketing Quotas Approved

Farmers have approved marketing quotas for the 1963 crop of upland cotton. The returns in Donley County from the Dec. 11 referendum show favorable votes by 73 percent of the 172 cotton farmers voting.

Approval of the quotas by cotton growers means that (1) quotas with penalties on excess cotton will be in effect for the 1963 crop, and (2) price support to growers who comply with their farm allotments will be at the full level available under the law. The marketing quota penalty on "excess" upland cotton will be 50 percent of the upland cotton parity price as of June 15, 1963.

**Examination Slated
For Hedley Postmaster**

An examination for Postmaster at Hedley, Texas, \$5365 a year, will be open for acceptance of applications until January 2, 1963 the U. S. Civil Service Commission has announced.

Competitors for the postmaster vacancy in this city must have at least 1 year of experience (education above high school level may be substituted for 6 months of experience) showing that they have the ability to maintain simple records of accounts or that it has given them a knowledge of postal procedures

Competitors must also show that they are of good reputation and that they can meet and deal with the public agreeably and effectively.

Applicants must take a written test. Those who pass will be assigned final ratings on the basis of this test and on their experience, and fitness for the position. They must have resided within the delivery of the office for one year immediately preceding the closing date of the examination. In addition, they must have reached their 18th birthday on the closing date for acceptance of applications. Persons over 70 years of age cannot be appointed.

Complete information about the examination requirements and instructions for filing applications may be obtained at the post office for which this examination is being announced. Application forms must be filed with the U. S. Civil Service Commission, Washington, 25, D. C., and must be received or postmarked not later than the closing date.

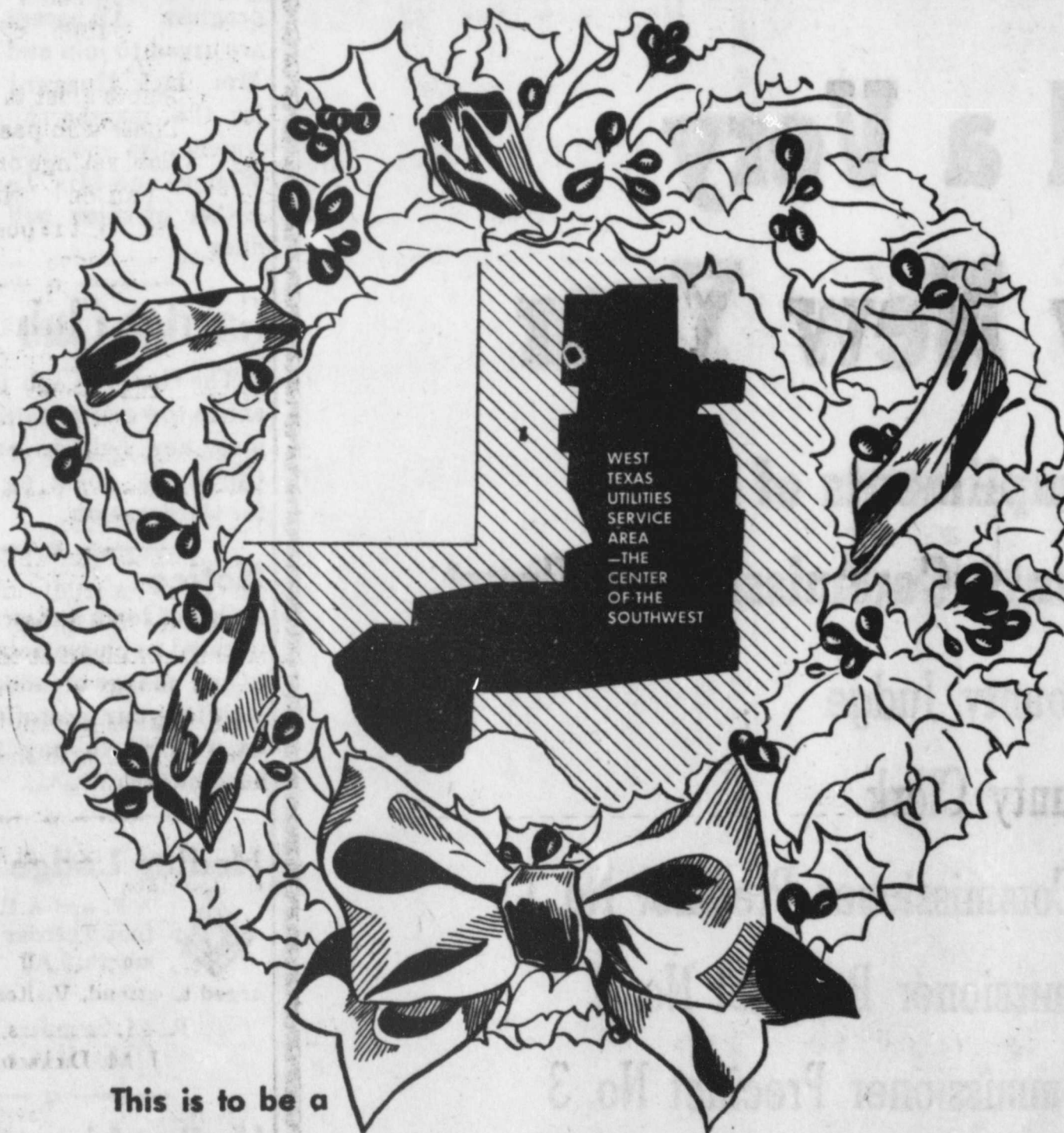

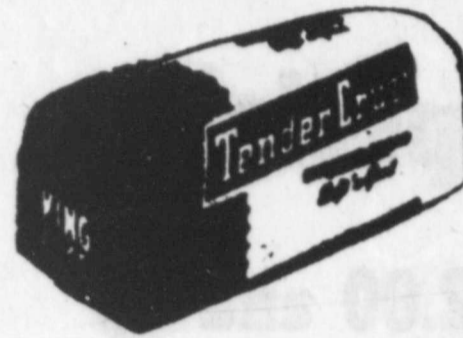
