**Release Of Cotton Allotments**

This year again, as in the past several years, those farmers that will not plant their cotton allotments are urged to release the acreage to the County Committee for reapportionment. Each year considerable acreage is lost to both county and state by farmers failing to release their allotment. March 4, 1963, is the last day to release the allotment.

**Cotton Pre-Measurement**

Producers may, by paying for the service, have their cotton pre-measured and staked provided application for the service is filed in the County ASCS Office before March 29, 1963.

**Feed Grain Signup**

The 1963 feed grain signup is well under way in the county office. Several producers who did not clearly understand the program, have been to the office and we have figured the different ways that the program could be applied to their individual farm. Consequently, they now have a clearer meaning of the program.
