According to the records of the Motor Vehicle Inspection Service of the DPS there are 4,325 vehicles registered in Donley County and only 953 or 22 percent of the vehicles have been inspected to date. Due to this low number Captain Alan Johnson suggested that all motorists check their vehicle and see if they have a current 1963 inspection sticker on the windshield and if not to have their vehicle inspected today in order to avoid the last minute rush.

All vehicles coming under the provisions of the Texas Vehicle Inspection Act must secure the 1963 Inspection sticker by April 15, 1963. After that date, vehicles not displaying the new inspection sticker will be operating in violation of the law.

**Farm Facts**

The history of barley is almost as old as that of agriculture. It is believed to have originated in Asia and to have been grown in Egypt nearly 70 centuries ago. The cereal is mentioned in the Bible and mythology and dates back to 3500 B.C. in Mesopotamia, 3000 B.C. in Europe, and 2000 B.C. in China.

Barley has the shortest growing season of any cereal and because of this can be grown in the cool climate of Norway or in hot, dry Morocco.

Although used primarily for livestock feed in the United States, barley is an important item in the human diet in parts of Africa and Asia.

Since antiquity, barley has been used in the brewing of beer, and today nearly all beer is made from it. More than 85 million bushels are consumed in the U.S. annually for alcohol and alcoholic beverages as compared with about 230 million bushels for livestock feed. ●
