Feed Grain Sign-Up Closes

As of the closing date, March 22, farmers in Donley County had signed up 278 farms to participate in the 1963 feed grain program. The "intention to participate" forms show 10,238 acres to be diverted from the production of corn, grain sorghum, and barley. The diversion is from base acreages of 31,834 acres.

For farms signed up, estimated total payments for diverting acreage amount to \$77,902.00, not including price support payments to be made this fall.

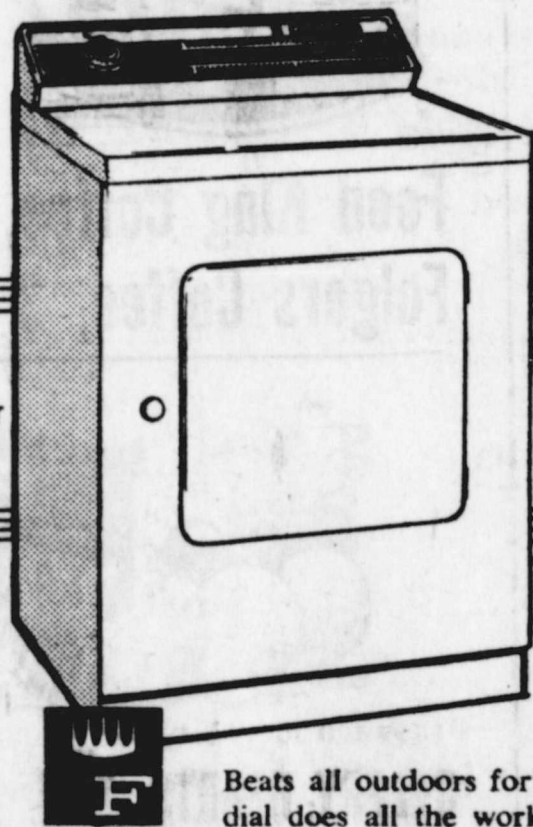

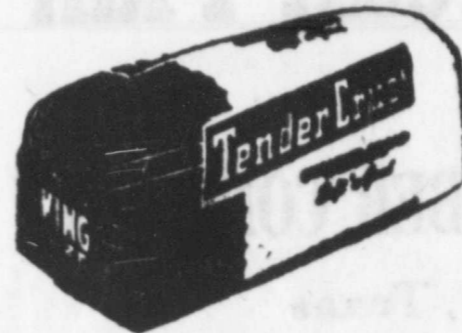
