At regular City Council meeting last Thursday night, Mayor Clifford Johnson resigned his office, and was appointed as Hedley representative on the Greenbelt Water Authority. This position had been left vacant by the resignation of A W Anderson, who had withdrawn as Greenbelt director due to other business.

The administration of Mayor Johnson had been quite successful, with the Hedley water system much improved and other improvements made, while the City's bonded indebtedness has dontinued to decrease. He has been active on the Greenbelt water project even before the water authority was created, and felt that he could serve Hedley better on the water authority than as Mayor.

The Council appointed D. E. Boliver to fill out the unexpired term of Mayor Johnson.
