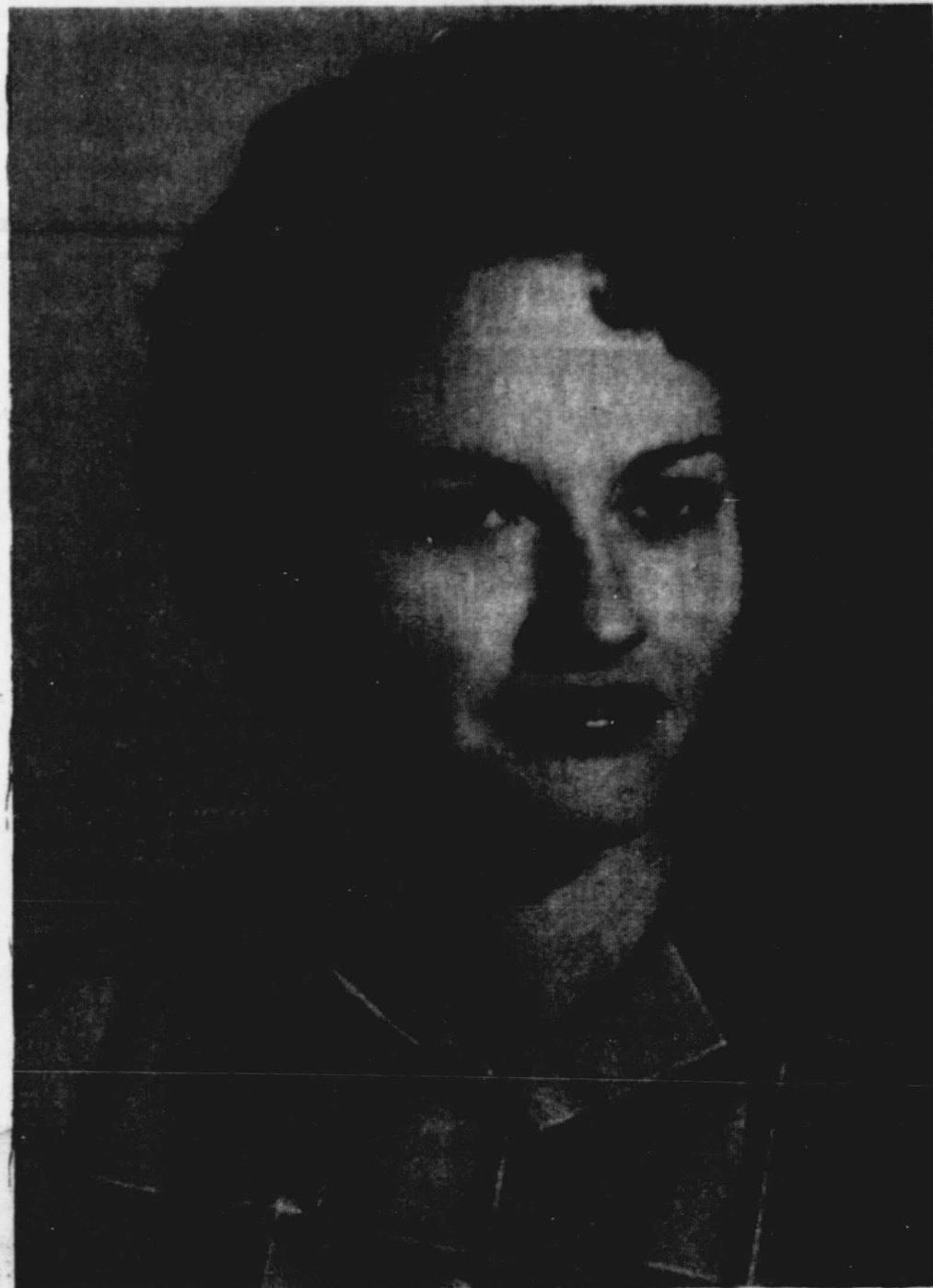

Greenbelt Dam

Clifford Johnson and James Evans recently visited the new site of the Greenbelt Dam on Salt Fork which is located about one mile east of Lelia Lake.

The site appears to be a good one with enough level land around the dam site for the filter plant, concessions and cabins. The lake itself will be a deep one with high banks. The depth at the dam will be over 70 feet and the lake will have an average depth of over 35 feet.

Will Chamberlain and others who live near the river say if there is a gyp rock in the entire reservoir no one has been able to find it.

The engineers estimate the lake will furnish three times as much water as the interested cities will be using in 2003 when the bonds mature. This being the case the State will be asked to pay two thirds of the cost of the dam and land. The estimated cost is \$4,500,000 so the authority's part would be \$1,500,000.

The estimated cost of the pipe lines and filter plant is \$6,000,000. A revenue bond issue is contemplated to be paid from the revenues received from the lake with no

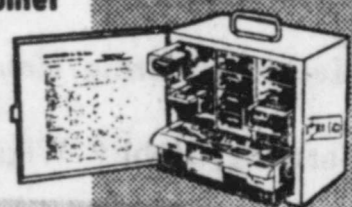

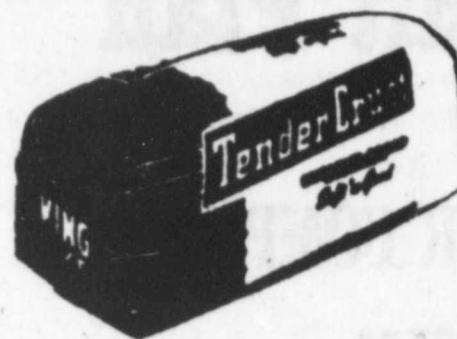
