Greenbelt Dam

This is a very busy week for the directors of the Greenbelt Water Authority. They had a meeting with the Authority's engineers scheduled for Wednesday night, Thursday the directors and engineers are meeting with the City Councils of Quanah, Childress and Paducah, and Friday they will meet with the Memphis, Hedley and Clarendon Councils.

The report of the engineers, Freese, Nichols and Endress of Fort Worth, was received last week. Now that the directors and councils of the interested cities have had time to digest it they plan immediate action. The report was better than expected. We can go into details later. Col. S. Freese, senior member of the firm, states, "We are of the opinion that the project, as finally worked out, is sound, in that the supply is adequate, the water will be of good quality for municipal use, and the cost is reasonable."

Elections for the voting of the water contracts and bond issue are slated to be within the next 60 days. The bonds will be in the amount of \$7,518,000 and will be a revenue bond with no property taxes involved. No increase in water rates is anticipated for any of the interested cities. In fact, according to the report, water can be purchased cheaper from the lake than can be pumped from our own wells.

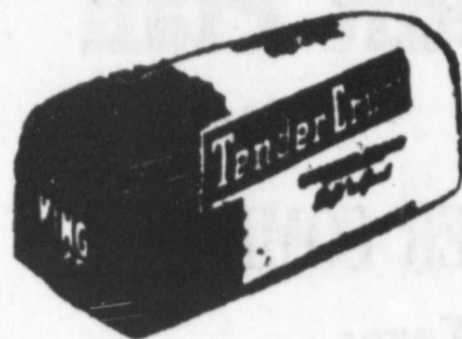
