News From Our County Agent

County Agent Flip Breedlove announced today that the first confirmed case of screwworms was located 8½ miles south of Hedley last Saturday. The sample was found by Earl Wheatly and was sent to the screwworm eradication program at Mission, Texas.

Monday morning a representative of the eradication program arrived in Breedlove's office and went to the ranch to mark the location so that sterile flies can be dropped by plane. Mr. Chaney, the program representative, said that in 48 hours from the time that the case of screwworms was confirmed and the spot marked, sterile flies would be dropped in the area. The number of flies dropped will be sufficient to cover an area of about seven miles square.

Breedlove is urging all livestock owners in the county to be on the lookout for screwworm cases and to immediately put eight or ten worms in a container and ship to the Screwworm Eradication Program, Box 969, Mission, Texas. Containers for shipping can be secured at Breedlove's office and no postage is necessary. Be sure to fill out the papers enclosed with the shipment so that the location of the case can be identified on a map for dropping of sterile flies.

Diverted Acres

To be designated as diverted acreage, land must be in who's fields or in areas of reasonable size within fields. Turn rows, drainage ditches, wet low-lying areas, droughty knobs or banks, other areas which normally would not produce a crop, and strips of less than four normal rows in skip row planting patterns will not qualify.

Substitution of other eligible land for designated diverted acreage will be permitted if a request for such substitution is made not

later than the time the reporter secures the initial acreage report for corn and grain sorghums.

Feed Grain and Cotton Performance

We will begin measuring feed grain and cotton acreage in July. Those of you in the feed grain program will have to designate diverted acres when the reporter makes the initial visit to the farm. If you want to have an area measured off, please come by the ASCS Office for assistance. The reporter cannot determine the acreage in the field.

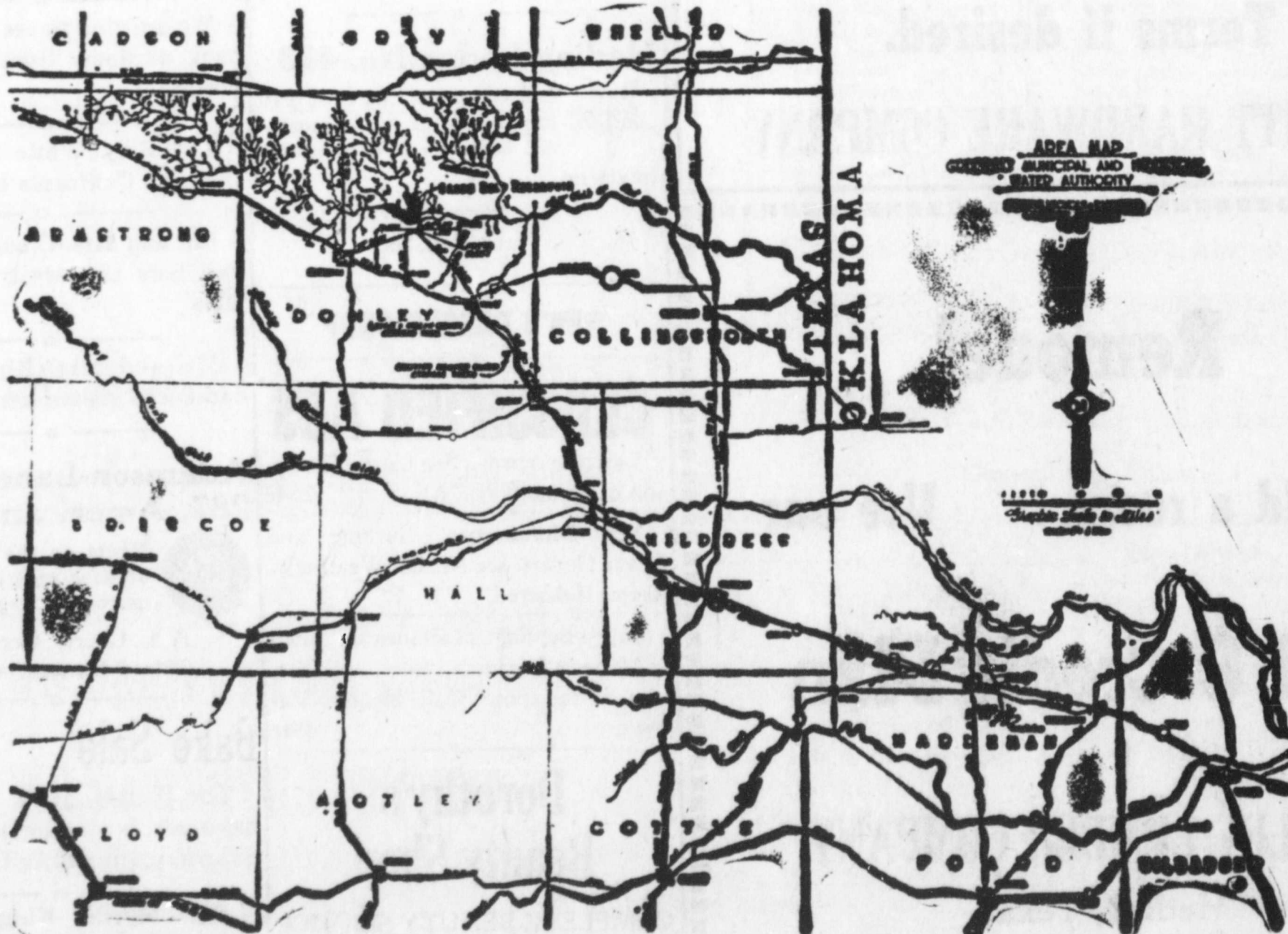

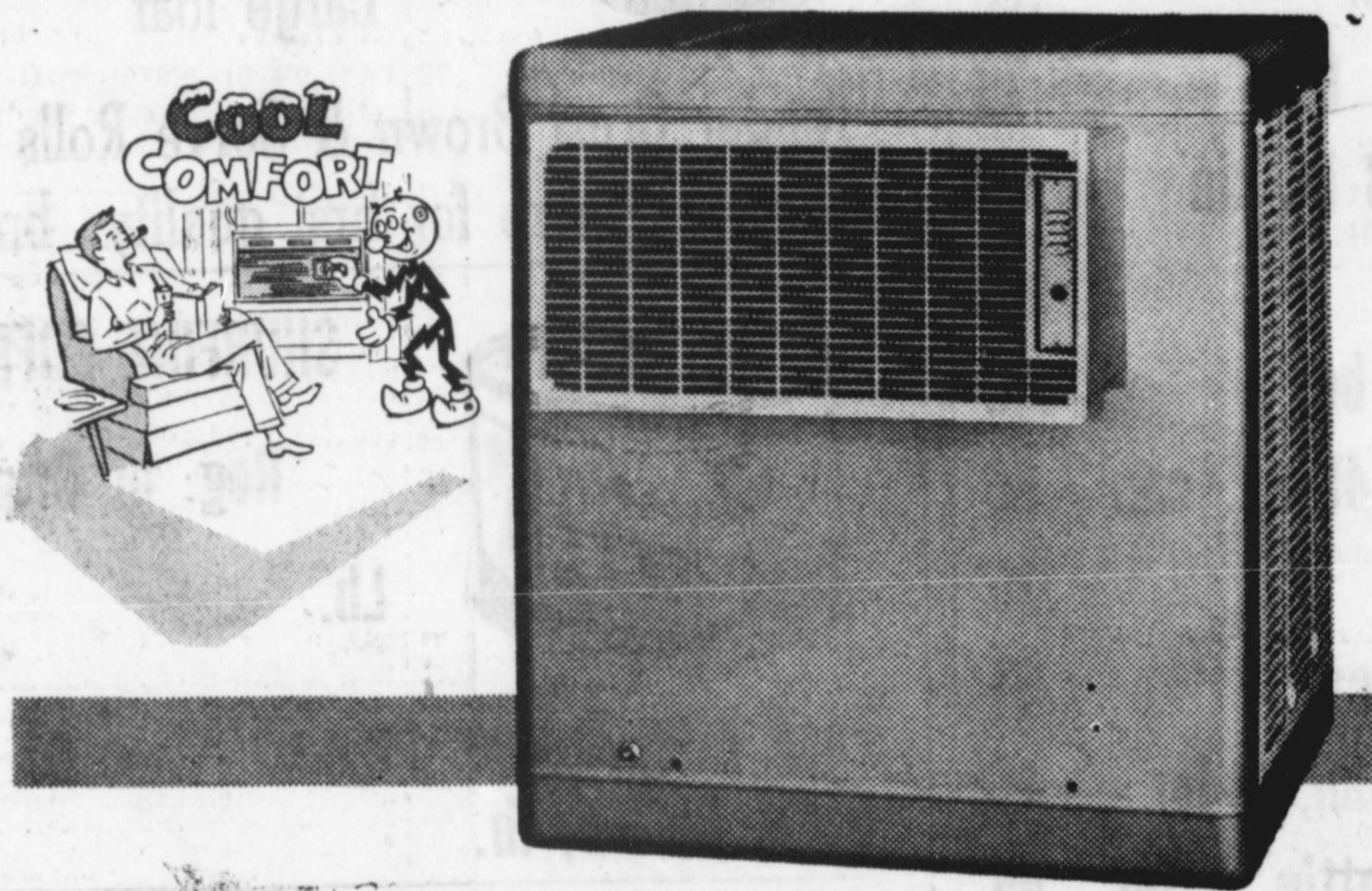

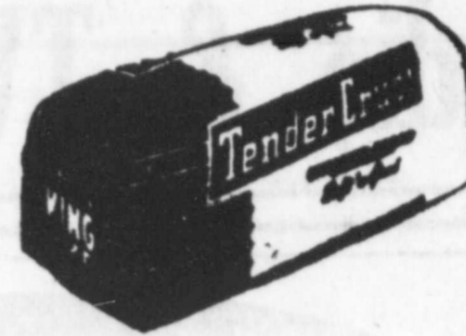
