Water Contract Election To Be Sept. 28 Classing Office

Hedley citizens will go to the polls next Saturday, Sept. 28, to vote on a very important issue affecting the future of Hedley and S Department of Agriculture. several other towns in this area The issue is, whether or not to approve the water contract between the City of Hedley and the Greenbelt Municipal and Industrial Water Authority, whereby the Authority will furnish water to a number of cities in this area from the proposed Greenbelt reservoir. Besides Hedley the cities of Childress, Quanah and Clarendon will vote on the contract on Sept 28. Paducah and Crowell are expected to hold elections later on this project.

The water to be obtained from the Salt Fork of Red River is believed to be the only drinkable ples per day. water supply still available for this part of Texas. It is true that Hedley has a good supply of water at this time, but it is also true that no one knows when the underground water supply will cease to be adequate Hedley has had to drill two new wells within the past four years, and the last one took considerable searching before an adequate supply was found.

The Authority is expected to deliver water into Hedley's water tower for 30¢ per 1,000 gallons of filtered and treated water. Also, the Authority has now agreed to let Hedley contract for 50,000 gallons of water per day instead of the recently proposed amount of 90 000 gallons per day, which should place Hedley in a more favorable position.

The City Council has chosen the tentative rates which will be charged when the Greenbelt project goes into operation, and which are believed to be sufficient to pay for the water received by the City and still pay for the previous wells drilled, the City's bonded indebtedness, and normal operating expenses. These rates are as 1,000 follows:



Austin-Col. Homer Garrison Jr , director of the Texas Department of Public Safety, said today the new speed law effective Aug 23 specifically makes it a violation to drive a vehicle so slow as to impede traffic.

He said that before enactment of the new law it was necessary for a police officer to warn a driver impeding traffic to speed up or get off the road before filing a

"Under the new statute, as we interpret it, whenever a driver is driving slower than the normal and reasonable movement of traffic and thereby impeding that traffic, he will be committing a violation for which he may be charged in court," Garrison said.


