Legal Notice

All interested persons are advised that the construction of additional traffic lanes are being planned by the Texas Highway Commission on U. S Highway 287 from near the East city limits of Clarendon through Hedley. The contemplated additional traffic lanes will parallel the present traffic lanes in the rural portion to provide a divided highway similar to that now built from Clarendon West. These divided lanes will transition to each other within the cities of Clarendon, Lelia Lake and Hedley. These city sections will have the present paved streets widened sufficiently to provide for four traffic lanes.

Preliminary drawings showing the proposed location are on file at the Resident Engineers office in Clarendon and at the District Engineers office in Childress.

Any interested citizen may request that a public hearing be held respecting such proposed location and the economic effect of such location by delivering a written request to the Resident Engineer or the District Engineer on or before the 7th day of November 1963. In the event such request is received, a public hearing will be scheduled and adequate notice will be given as to its time and place.

Grain Sorghum Loans

The county loan rate for grain sorghum grading No. 2 or better is \$1.69 per cwt. If the grain is stored in a warehouse, the warehouse storage charges will be deducted from the loan rate. All grain sorghum produced on the farm is eligible for loan this year. An eligible farm is one which participated in the 1963 Feed Grain Program by diverting land from the production of feed grains.

Cotton Classing

Cotton classed during the week through Friday, October 18, continued to be of good quality, says K. E. Voelkel of the U. S. D. A. Cotton Classing Office in Memphis Texas.

For the week, white grades increased to 47 percent compared with 44 percent the previous week. About 51 percent of the cotton graded was Light Spotted and less than 2 percent fell in the Spotted category. The predominant grade for the week was Strict Middling White with 23 percent. About 3 percent of the samples classed were reduced in grade because of bark. The good quality of cotton classed thus far may be attributed to good harvesting practices as well as good ginning. It is a known fact, but sometimes not practiced, that the grade of the cotton is only as good as the quality of harvested cotton delivered to the gin.

The Texas Highway Patrol investigated 2 accidents on rural highways in Donley County during the month of September, according to Sergeant J. W. Wilson, Highway Patrol supervisor of this area

These wrecks accounted for an estimated property damage of \$1,900 00

The rural traffic accident summary for this county from January through September of 1963 shows a total of 27 accidents resulting in 1 person killed, 15 persons injured and an estimated property damage of \$20,548 00

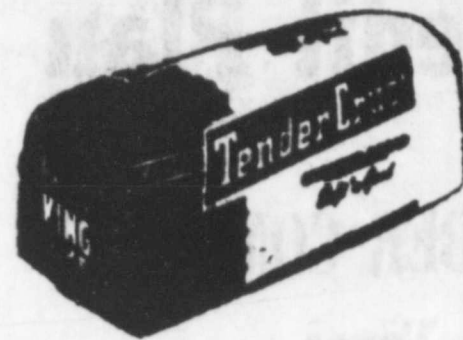
