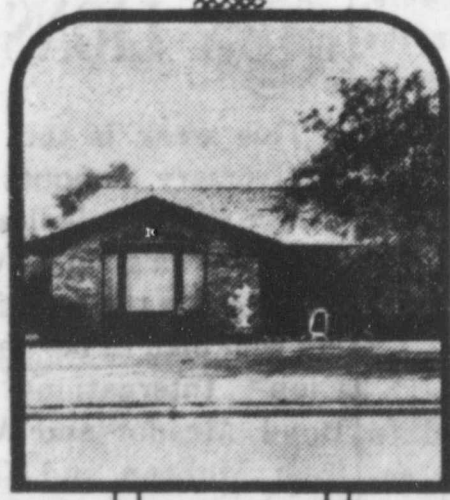

Unreported Wheat And Barley
There are some producers in this county who do not have a wheat allotment but who may have wheat for harvest in 1964. If you do have wheat seeded and it has not been measured, it may be to your advantage to report that acreage to the county office, as we have no way of knowing about such acreage unless it is reported to us

Also, if you are participating in the feed grain program and have barley seeded, it must be reported. Barley is a part of the feed grain base and it is eligible for the price support payment.

Premeasurement Service For Feed Grains

We now have approval from the State Office to offer the premeasurement service for feed grains and diverted acres. The cost of the service will be the same as for cotton and the last day to make application at the Donley ASOS County Office will be April 30.

Diverted Acres
The initial designated acres to be diverted under the 1964 Feed Grain Program must be regular in shape with not more than four sides unless it is a whole field or sub division or if a terrace, road, or ditch forms the perimeter of the acreage. Each plot must contain at least 1 acre. Less than four normal rows in a skip-row planting pattern will not qualify for diverted acre.

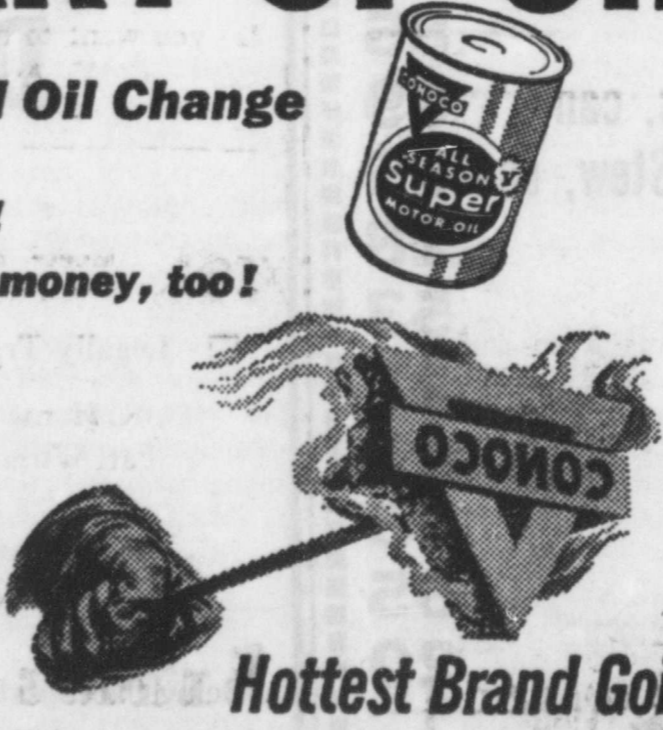



News From Our County Agent

County Agent Flip Breedlove says that the time fast approaches to be on the look out for screw worms. We had a wonderful year last year with very few cases reported in Donley County. Breedlove says that this was due a great deal to the cooperation of all livestock owners in spraying of cattle and when they did find a case of screw worms, the sample of worms was sent to the Mission, Texas laboratory at once.

Containers for shipping in samples of worms when they are found are available in the office of the county agent. All livestock owners who do not have a container should drop by the county agent's office and get some before the screw worm time arrives.

Breedlove also asked that all livestock owners who find worms in livestock wounds let him know when the samples are mailed out. It is understood that sterile flies will be dropped in infested areas again this year.

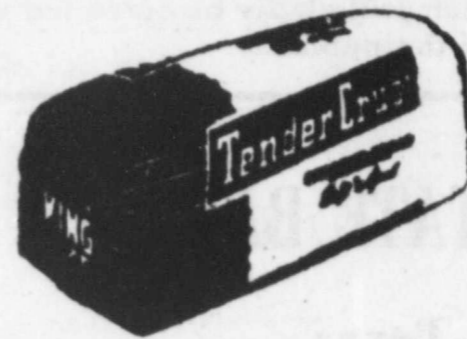
