## Greenbelt Dam

There will be no action taken and probably no directors meetings until after Aug. 3, 1964, the last day to accept appeals on the action of the Texas Water Commission's permit to the Greenbelt Municipal and Industrial Water Authority.

Collingsworth County Water Dist. No. 1 has not filed an appeal and their President Dan Henard has written the Commission that they do not intend to appeal. However the attorneys of the Lewis estate have filed an appeal in Travis County in regard to the dam site on the Lewis estate.

While marking time the Authority's engineers have fully explored and tested both the possible locations on the Salt Fork and Lake Creek. Much coring has been done.

The data will be submitted to the board of directors at the next meeting. It could be possible that smaller dams on Lake Creek and the upper part of Salt Fork would be more feasible. In that case the attorneys of the Lewis estate promise to withdraw their appeal.

Both Quanah and Childress are now rationing water and the waters from Lake Creek will be utilized as soon as possible. It is still hoped that water can be gotten to them by spring or early summer. Clifford Johnson, Director, Greenbelt Water Authority.

## Transportation Contracts at CJC

Transportation of students from surrounding towns to Clarendon Junior College is available through student car contracts. A student who resides in an area town may enter into a contract with the college to transport other students from his area. The driver-student is paid according to the distance each student travels in his automobile to school. There must be a minimum of three students riding with the driver before a group is eligible for a contract. The college will pay two cents per mile for travel, plus the following amount each month:

- 60 miles or over travelled one way —\$10 per rider, per month
- 50 to 60 miles—\$9
- 40 to 50 miles—\$8
- 30 to 40 miles—\$7
- Under 30 miles—\$5

Students who ride with a contract driver may also pay him a like amount each month. Such a contract enables a student to drive his car to school at almost no expense to himself and provides the same transportation for those who ride with him at a very nominal cost.

Students who desire to negotiate such a contract should contact the Dean's office as soon as possible. It is preferred that these contracts be confirmed before a school term begins.

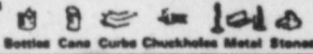

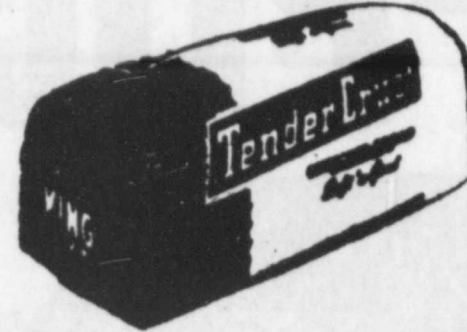
