## 13th Cotton Festival Is Great Success

The 13th annual Hedley Cotton Festival, held last Friday and Saturday, was perhaps one of the most memorable of all the long series. It was an unqualified success, even the weather cooperating generously.

The kiddies parade Saturday morning showed that much thought and work had gone into its preparation. Many of the entries were unusually clever and amusing.

At their own request, the high school bands were not judged. For junior high bands, McLean won first and Memphis second.

Climax of the Festival was the coronation Saturday night in the high school. A very outstanding program was arranged by Mrs. Don Springer and emceed by Gene Allison, and the stage was decorated beautifully for the occasion. As the twelve Queen contestants entered, Jamie Evans was announced as the second place contestant and Kathy Spier was announced as the third place contestant, and they took their places as honorary princesses beside Queen Brenda Winn, in whose honor the program was given. At the close of the very interesting and entertaining program, Ricki Rowell was named as the incoming Cotton Festival Queen, and was crowned by District Governor James Wheeler of Amarillo. All twelve of these lovely girls should be commended for their wonderful work in selling tickets. They raised a total of \$2,537.82, which is a new record for Cotton Festival ticket sales.

Also of much interest Saturday night was the Old Fiddlers contest, in charge of W. L. Mosley. Wes Nivens of Hart won first in this event, Bill Murray of Phillips second, and Ray David of Clarendon third.

There is not space to try to list all those who helped to make this Festival the success that it was, but perhaps they can get a greater satisfaction from the knowledge of a job well done.
