Agriculture Census

Louise Henard of Wellington has been named a crew leader for the 1964 Census of Agriculture, in Thomas Nursing Home at Welregional office of the U.S. Bureau today. The new crew leader is one of about 1,825 persons this appointment.

The new crew leader will supervise a team of census enumerators who will visit all farms and ranches in Donley County to collect official census questionaires from farm operators. Enumeration of all farms in the county will take place in November and early December.

The census will be taken in the following way: Shortly after Nev. 5, the Bureau of the Census, an agency of the U.S Department of Commerce, will mail census questionnaires to all rural boxholders Those required to fill out the forms should do so and hold the questionnaires until a census enumerator comes to collect them. At that time, the enumerator will help answer any questions that may have proved troublesome.

The crew leader is a key person in conducting a Census of Agriculture He recruits and trains the enumerators, schedules their work, reviews the accuracy of completed forms, and conducts difficult interviews

The Census of Agriculture is taken every five years in years ending in "4" and "9" to gather information on the nation's agricultural resources and production. Such information is vital in making decisions affecting many segments of the U.S economy. Data gathered include the number and size of farms, acreage and harvest of crops livestock inventories, and information on farm equipment and improvements and income and some production expenditures

The information will be pub lished starting in 1965 for counties, States, and the nation.

Amendments

Voters will decide Nov. 3 on three proposed changes in the state constitution. Apparently there is not a great deal of argument over the state about the Nov. 7th, with registration from three amendments.

No 1 would remove the legislature's authority to transfer up to one per cent of the permanent school fund annually to the available school fund.

No 2 would require notice to the public and to the Texas Watduce legislation creating or substantially attering a conservation sitting from 10 a. m to 9:30 p m. and reclamation district.

No 3 would authorize the legisislature to enact a program, under the federal Kerr-Mills act, of financial help for Texans 65 and older who are not on the old age assistance rolls but who can't pay

These questions will be for the voters to decide.




Cotton Report

With near perfect weather prevailing during the week ending Friday, Oct. 23, cotton harvesting in this section of the Panhandle continued to lag, according to the U S D A.'s cotton classing office in Memphis. Due to the lateness of the crop, and the desire of farmers wanting to wait for a killing frost before harvesting are the chief reasons for the small volume

During the week we classed at Utleyville, Co'o., and Mrs Olen 2700 samples compared with 3200 last week stated K E. Voelkel in charge of the Memphis classing office. For the season we classed about 6,000 compared With 15,000 doso, N. Mex They also visited as of the same date last year. This reflects the delay in harvesting even though a large percent-

The 4-H Tractor program has trained well over a million youths to drive safely, handle the big machines and keep them in working order year around. The project is planned and supervised by the Cooperative Extension Service. In this state and five others, educational aids and awards are provided by the Humble Oil & Refining Company.

With today's big investments in farm equipment, it is vital that tractors are adequately maintained and put to maximum use, points out 4-H Club leaders. A breakdown could mean financial loss on crops.


There is always plenty to do in this project, even for the beginner. The program is divided into four sections. The first year participation acquaints the member with the tractor and safe rules for operation.

Second year members learn to operate the tractor and what it takes to keep it going. Care of battery, spark plugs, cooling system and tires is taught. Operating costs, including fuel and lubrication also are studied.

"Improving Your Skills" is the title of the third unit. This emphasizes highway safety, power take-off, brakes, power transmission, winter care and ownership costs.

The fourth year and advanced unit goes into detail on machinery care such as servicing and maintaining tillage tools, planters, harvesters and sprayers. By the time 4-H'ers have completed the fourth year, they usually have assumed responsibility for not only the farm tractors, but other machinery as well.

Over the years thousands of young 4-H farmers have been recognized in various ways for doing a superior job. The program sponsor this year again will provide an expense-paid trip to the National 4-H Club Congress in Chicago for the state winner. College scholarships worth \$500 each will be awarded to the top 12 members across the nation. They will be designated by the Extension Service.


