





Steak Marinated in Beer and Green Onions

2 pounds boneless top sirloin

steak, all visible fat removed

- 11/2 cups light beer (regular or nonalcoholic) (12 ounces)
- green onions, minced
- tablespoons light brown sugar 2 tablespoons dry sherry
- 1 tablespoon grated fresh gingerroot tablespoon light soy sauce
- medium cloves garlic, minced, or 1 teaspoon bottled minced
- teaspoon crushed red pepper flakes
- teaspoon acceptable* vegetable oil Dash of red hot-pepper oil

Put steak in an airtight plastic bag.
