### HE GRAND JURIES

n Half a Dozen States Will Investigate Evidence Incriminating Men High in Business Circles.

Associated Press. Chicago, Ill., May 24 .- A dispatch to the Tribune from Washington says:
"Amazing revelations of a conspiracy to defraud the United States of millions of dollars worth of mineral

and timber lands will be laid before the grand juries in half a dozen states within a few days. The facts, it is said, will involve in criminal charges men high in business and social circles including one United States senator, one former senator, a man reputed to be one of the wealthlest in the world a railroad man known from the Atlantie to the Pacific, two of the wealthlest coal barons in the United States and numerous smaller fry. The frauds, it is declared, were perpetrated in California, Colorado, Washington, Oregon, Montana, Minnesota and the Dakotas. Much of the evidence was secured by Detective Burns, who is engaged in the municipal graft prosecution in San Francisco, and upon the conclusion of his work there Burns and Attorney Francis J. Heney are expected to return to the government service for the prosecution of timber and mineral land thieves. In obtaining the conviction of the men said to be involved in the frauds, the government expects to regain possession of
