

Washington was a son of Augustine Washington and his second wife, Mary Ball, a descendant of John Washington, who in migrated from England io

George received only an average edacation, which con-tsted in reading. writing and arithmetic. When he was fourteen he studied geometry. It is thought that he was never master of no language save the English, though he studied French some. In school he was the leader in all plays, excelled all in athletic sports.

During Adams'administration he was made commander in chief of an army. But his service to the country was ended. He died December 14, 1799. His last words were, "It is well ' The whole world mourred his death, and well they might, for by losing him they lost one of their greatest men.

It has been said of him that he was first in peace, first in war, and first in the hearts of his countrymen, and that he died on the last day of the week, the last honr of the day, the last month of the year and the last year of the
