The Days of Barter Are Over

At one time, men traded an animal's skin for a stone axe, a canoe for a certain amount of labor.

Today there is a medium of exchange by which all things are measured. You do not express the value of your horse in terms of a number of day's labor. Your home represents a certain amount of money.

Everything is valued by our money standard, yet there is not enough money in the world to do a strictly cash business. It is through the help of banks that the immense volume of business is carried on.

For example, ten men deposit a hundred dollars each in the bank. Not all of them will want their money at the same time; one may draw his money in ten days, another in thirty days, and so on. The banker can loan out a certain per cent of this money to other men who wish to improve or stock their farms, buy new goods for their business, or build homes. This loaned money finds its way back to the bank; it is turned over many times, so that the one thousand dollars deposited by the ten men may do business amounting to ten or twenty thousand dollars.

The entire community is benefitted by this system, made possible only by the bank and its confidence in men to pay their obligations.

SCHOLASTICS INCREASE

Brady Has a Total of 673, an Increase of About Fifty Over Last Year. County Shows Increase.

County Judge Walker, as ex-officio county superintendent, is busy just now formulating the scholastic census for McCulloch county. He is being assisted by his daughter, Miss Jackye, and the complete report for the county will not be ready for publication for some weeks yet as some of the districts have not yet reported. Enough have come in, however, to indicate that there will be a healthy increase shown over last year, one or two of the districts already showing an increase of more than 100 per cent.

The report for Brady shows the total number of scholastics to be 673, a gain of about fifty over last year. Figuring the town's population on this basis at the usual ratio of 7 to 1, gives Brady a population of 4,711, which, evidently, is not far from being about the correct figures.

Armor for Commissioner.

J. J. Armor, of Voca, authorizes The Standard to announce him as a candidate for re-election to the office of county commissioner from the Voca precinct, No. 2. Mr. Armor is the present incumbent, and during his past service as commissioner he has been a success. His fellow commissioners have great respect for his abilities and the people of the county at large will be well pleased with his re-election. There are some changes and additions to be made to the plans and specifications, which matters it is thought will be shaped in a few days, and the work of construction will begin soon. The plans call for an exceedingly nice building for the amount invested, and will be treated further in these columns next week, showing also, we hope, a picture of the building.
