CITY COUNCIL.

GOES OVER MATTER WITH

EXPERT HAWLEY HERE

Water Expert Submits Definite Proposition for Constructing Dams, Remodeling, Etc.

Engineer John B. Hawley, water expert, was here Monday at the request of the city council, for the purpose of going over the plans for the building of the dams, taking over the present water plant, or such parts as may be used, and other matters incident to the beginning of the work of securing Brady's water supply.

Mr. Hawley, in company with the members of the city council, and the water committee made another trip to the sites previously selected for the building of the dams, and confirmed his first report as to the location. The upper dam site is about two miles from town, as the crow flies, or about three miles up the creek, and, according to Mr. Hawley, is as fine a natural site for a dam as he ever saw. The second dam site is about threequarters of a mile further down and is very similar from every standpoint to the first.
