LOCAL BRIEFS.

J. W. Embry reports keeping busy
as can be in his broom factory, and
says he can hardly keep up with
orders. Good broom corn is now
worth \$200 and \$300 per ton, with
general sales running around \$250.
Mr. Embry looks for a large acreage
of broom corn to be planted during
the coming year as a consequence of
these high prices.

G. B. Await, former commissioner,
was in Brady last Friday and report-
ed the Camps San Saba in the best
shape it has ever been. The road was
recently treated to some greatly
needed work, and the rains since
then have been sufficient to
settle the road bed and make travel
over it a delight. Mr. Await does
not attempt to disguise the fact
that there are still rocks in the roads,
but all chug holes have been done
away with, and travel of that high-
way has accordingly been made more
enjoyable than for many years.

E. B. Kennedy and J. M. Crum-
bley were visitors here from Waldrip
yesterday. Mr. Kennedy was in to
meet his son, Alvin, who was re-
turning home after spending a month
in Oklahoma, and who had tired of
"seeing the world." Mr. Kennedy re-
ported himself as well pleased with
his year's work. Four bales of cot-
ton alone netted him \$405, he having
sold them at 20c and having retained
the seed. However, he is not going
cotton wild but says he expects to
plant plenty of feed and raise his liv-
ing at home, as he has found
it too hard work to raise, gath-

er and market cotton and then pay
out the money in order to haul feed
home.

Joe Matthews, former Bradyite,
and recently elected one of the com-
missioners of Menard county, is a
good roads enthusiast, and during
his tenure in office we can confident-
ly look forward to some excellent
road building in his precinct. Upon
a recent visit to Brady Mr. Matthews
called attention to the wonderful sys-
tem of roads being built in Lampasas
county, which is now spending \$20,
000 annually in her roads. This sum
is divided among four commissioners,
each having \$5,000 at his disposal
for road building purposes. Each
commissioner selects a first-class
overseer, and at stated intervals the
body of commissioners make trips
over the various roads, and if an
overseer is found to be neglecting
his work he is promptly informed
that he must either discharge his
duties properly or be himself dis-
charged. Excuses do not count.
Sickness or any other excuse for fail-
ure to do the work is regarded as the
individual's misfortune, and not the
county's. As a result of this system
of operation, Lampasas county has
some of the finest roads in the state.
The Lampasas-Lometa road is a
notable example. It was constructed
at a cost of \$200 per mile.

Good broom corn is now worth \$200 and \$300 per ton, with general sales running around \$250. Mr. Embry looks for a large acreage of broom corn to be planted during the coming year as a consequence of these high prices.

G. B. Awalt, former commissioner, was in Brady last Friday and reported the Camps San Saba in the best shape it has ever been. The road was recently treated to some greatly needed work, and the rains since then have been sufficient to settle the road bed and make travel over it a delight. Mr. Awalt does not attempt to disguise the fact that there are still rocks in the roads, but all chug holes have been done away with, and travel of that high-way has accordingly been made more enjoyable than for many years.

E. B. Kennedy and J. M. Crumbley were visitors here from Waldrip yesterday. Mr. Kennedy was in to meet his son, Alvin, who was returning home after spending a month in Oklahoma, and who had tired of "seeing the world." Mr. Kennedy reported himself as well pleased with his year's work. Four bales of cotton alone netted him \$405, he having sold them at 20c and having retained the seed. However, he is not going cotton wild but says he expects to plant plenty of feed and raise his living at home, as he has found it too hard work to raise, gath-

er and market cotton and then pay out the money in order to haul feed home.

Joe Matthews, former Bradyite, and recently elected one of the commissioners of Menard county, is a good roads enthusiast, and during his tenure in office we can confidently look forward to some excellent road building in his precinct. Upon a recent visit to Brady Mr. Matthews called attention to the wonderful system of roads being built in Lampasas county, which is now spending \$20,000 annually in her roads. This sum is divided among four commissioners, each having \$5,000 at his disposal for road building purposes. Each commissioner selects a first-class overseer, and at stated intervals the body of commissioners make trips over the various roads, and if an overseer is found to be neglecting his work he is promptly informed that he must either discharge his duties properly or be himself discharged. Excuses do not count. Sickness or any other excuse for failure to do the work is regarded as the individual's misfortune, and not the county's. As a result of this system of operation, Lampasas county has some of the finest roads in the state. The Lampasas-Lometa road is a notable example. It was constructed at a cost of \$200 per mile.

TOURING THE U. S.

Driving Hupmobile, Party Plans Visit to Every State Capital.

Considerable interest was occasioned in Brady yesterday afternoon when F. R. Wulff, local agent for the Hupmobile, announced the passing through Brady of the Hupmobile which is now on its return trip to Washington, D. C., while making a tour of the U. S. during which every state capital will be visited. Quite a number of Brady live wires drove out to meet the party enroute here from San Angelo.

The trip is being made in the interests of good roads and national highways. Composing the party are C. E. Salisbury and C. R. Lipe, drivers, and W. A. Krohn, photographer. The party started from Washington, D. C., on August 28, 1916, and last week passed through the 35th state capital on the trip, Phoenix, Ariz. From here the party was enroute via Mason and Fredericksburg to Austin, which will be the 36th capital visited. From Austin they plan to visit Oklahoma, thence to Little Rock, Ark., Jackson, Mississippi, and Baton Rouge, La. The party first toured the New England states, and then zig-zagged back and forth traversing the Northern states. Their mileage up to the time of reaching Brady totaled 13,768.

The car was in itself unusually attractive, being of khaki color, while the members of the party were themselves clad in khaki.

The car was placed at the disposal of the party by the president of the Hupmobile Co., who also is paying the expenses of the trip. Both moving and still pictures are being made enroute. Photos are taken of especially good, or exceptionally bad stretches of road, and of scenes of interest in the various capitals.

Mr. Lipe reported many and thrilling occurrences on the trip. In Wyoming the party encountered snow from four to ten feet deep and had to shovel a path through the drifts. He found the roads in McCulloch county better than the majority in the Middle West, and said that the roads in New Mexico and Arizona were not bad, but were very dry. They were making no bets upon the time of their return to Washington, but hoped to be able to be in New York in time for the automobile show there on January 10th.
