
OLD WATER RATE RE-ESTABLISHED

Beginning June 1st - Lawn Sprinkling to be Permitted.

Beginning June 1st the old water rate is to be re-established. This means that all Brady patrons may use as much water as they may choose, and for whatever purpose, at the former rate of \$1.25 per 1,000 gallons. This does not apply to such patrons as are on a flat rate basis, whose use of water is restricted to domestic use only.
