F. W. HENDERSON SELLS BIG RANCH TO G. R. WHITE

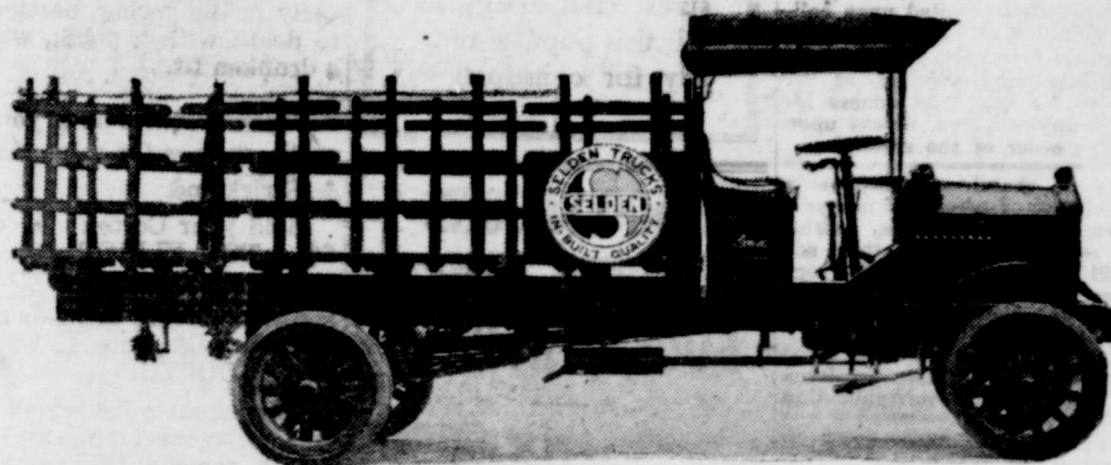

McCULLOCH OIL FIELD INVITES NEW COMPANY

The McCulloch county oil field looks inviting to more than one big oil company, and while work is progressing steadily in the making of a geological survey of the county for a California concern, still another concern is actively engaged in leasing land in the northern part of the county.

The Empire Gas & Fuel Co., of Bartlesville, Oklahoma, represented by W. A. Halamicek, is the latest concern to enter the local field and will actively advance its interests here. The Empire Gas & Fuel Co. is one of the newer companies in this section, but it is making up for this by being one of the most active. It has been established in Oklahoma for the past five years, and is really a part of the great Henry L. Doherty interests, which operate in 23 states, and which have one of the finest fields in the state of Kansas.

The company has been operating in the Brown and Coleman county fields now for about two months, but so far have brought in no wells, Mr. Halamicek stating that they were after deep stuff and did not stop to bother with shallow wells.

The company's future activities in McCulloch county will, quite naturally, depend upon Mr. Halamicek's success in securing sufficient leases to make the local field sufficiently promising to warrant them in moving deep well machinery here. However, Mr. Halamicek is confident that at no distant date active operations will be in progress here.

FIERCE BLAZE DESTROYS HOME TUESDAY MORN

Tuesday morning about 11:00 o'clock the fire department was called to the Marshall Rankin residence on South Blackburn, and despite the fact that the house was ablaze almost from one end to the other, within a remarkably short time they had subdued the flames. However, so great a start did the flames have, and so quickly did they spread, that only the shell of the house remains, and that practically beyond all repair.

The great clouds of smoke could be plainly seen from the business section, as well as from most parts of the residential section, and attracted much attention, not to say fears of those living in that neighborhood.

The dwelling was the property of Marshall Rankin, who estimates his loss at something over \$1000, fully covered by insurance. The house was occupied by W. I. Myers, who lost all his furniture, household effects and clothes. His loss he places at \$1200, only partly covered by insurance. Included in the destroyed articles was a watch set with five diamonds, and valued by Mrs. Myers as a graduation gift; also a diamond stud. trace of either of these articles could be found among the ruins. \$50,000 SECOND LIBERTY BONDS BOUGHT IN BRADY

Purchases of Second Liberty bonds in Brady totaled close to \$50,000, as compared with a total of \$36,700 of Liberty bonds of the first issue. These were purchased by customers of the Commercial National and Brady National banks, and do not include those purchased at Melvin, Mercury and several other points in the county.

Of the total amount, \$8,750 in Liberty bonds were sold by the Boy Scouts, and too much cannot be said in praise of the successful efforts of this patriotic bunch of Young Americans. The Boy Scouts were spurred in their efforts by the offer made by the government of a war service medal to each member who sold 10 or more bonds of any denomination. Eleven Boy Scouts qualified for the medal by selling the required number, the following being the names of these Boy Scouts: John Allison Polk, Jack Deaton, Leslie Townsend, Robt. Tabor, Hardin Jones, Edwin Sayles, Richard Davis, Glenn Ricks, Gerald Adkins, Walter Adkins, Ralston Taylor.

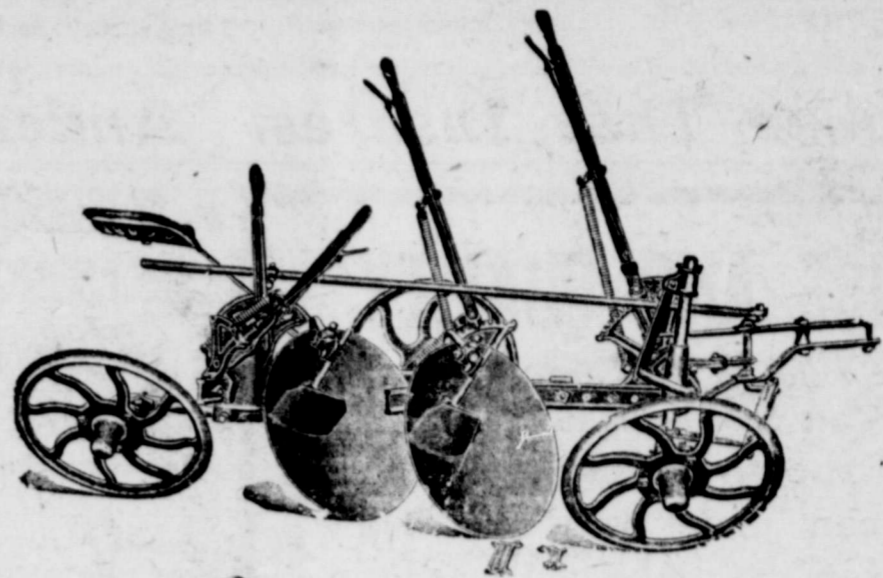

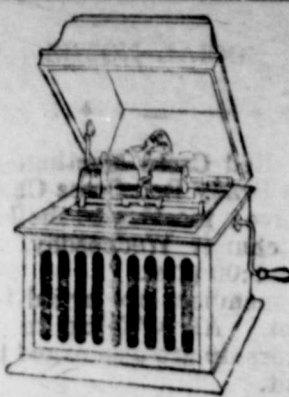
