GETTING READY FOR CALLAN MURDER TRIAL—INVESTIGATION MADE

Dayton Moses, of Fort Worth, leading counsel for James Callan, who is charged by complaint with killing T. R. Billings at Menard last November, was a passenger on the east bound Santa Fe Tuesday morning.

Judge Moses had been out in the Menard country and went from there to San Angelo, and was supposed to be in this part of the state preparing for the investigation which will begin at Menard next week when the grand jury convenes.

The murder with which Callan stands charged, is fresh in the minds of the people of this country. He is alleged to have shot Billings, a young Dewitt county stockman, when the two men met in the road on the Callan ranch, after some words had passed between them over a charge that Billings had left a gate on the Callan ranch open.

After the killing Callan surrendered to the officers and was placed under \$20,000 bond to await action of the grand jury.

Billings is said to have had many friends who are determined to see that justice is carried out in the trial of the case, while Callan is prominent among the cattle raisers of Texas, and the leading counsel for him is also counsel for the Texas Cattle Raisers' association.—Ballinger Banner-Ledger.

FIND BODY OF 4-YEAR OLD MEXICAN BOY NEAR MERCURY—LOST FEB. 13

LITTLE FELLOW STRAYS FROM FATHER, SHEEP HERDER FOR COLBERT PENN, AND DIES FROM HUNGER AND EXHAUSTION THREE MILES FROM HOME.

Death from hunger and exhaustion during the bitter cold weather of February was the fate of a little Mexican boy, aged about 4½ or 5 years, son of a Mexican sheepherder for Colbert Penn in the Mercury community. The little fellow strayed off from his father while out herding sheep on February 13th, and despite the efforts of searchers, no trace of him was found. Last Thursday while John Beasley of Mercury and W. N. White of this city were riding after some cattle, the former caught sight of a body lying in some high broom weeds on Cedar creek, near Mercury. Investigation proved it was the body of the little Mexican lad. Although it had lain exposed to wind and weather for six weeks, the body was remarkably well preserved.

The little lad's mother has been dead for some time, and the father was wont to take the boy with him while out herding sheep. On February 13th the father reported that the boy had strayed away from the place where he had been left. Search was immediately instituted, and continued far into the night. The next day it was resumed, and continued for several days, without results. In the meantime, the father displayed such utter indifference, going about his duties as usual and making no effort to aid in the search, that it was decided he had a guilty knowledge of the boy's whereabouts, and so the search was ended.

The point where the body was found was about 3 1-2 miles from the Mexican's camp. Because of the bitter cold weather at the time, it is presumed the boy died the first night after being missed. It would appear that after his long wanderings, he had lain down exhausted, and succumbed to cold and exhaustion.

U. S. TO REFUND \$232,949.00 TO WOOL GROWERS

Washington, March 23.—In order that \$232,949.18 can be returned to customers of the Wool Growers' Central Storage Company of San Angelo, representatives Hudspeth and Latham today received letters from Sam Hill, vice president of the company, asking that a hearing be arranged. Hudspeth has written Bernard M. Baruch, president of the War Industries Board during the war, asking that the hearing be set between April 10 and 15.

Hill claims that the Government, in taking over the 1918 wool clip, fixed three prices of 1.65, 1.70 and 1.75 per cent, but that Government appraisers did not abide by this price. He claims twelve different prices were fixed, many below the real valuation, and always unfair to the grower.

The loss to this concern alone was \$232,949.18. It is understood the War Industries Board has in effect recognized the injustice and is ready to make reparation if a satisfactory arrangement can be made.

THOS. NETHERWOOD, FORMER McCULLOCH CITIZEN, HERE FROM ENGLAND

One of the most appreciated of The Standard's callers the past week was Thos. Netherwood, who is here from Bay Hall, Huddersfield, England, on his first visit in a number of years. After visiting one of his sons in Dallas, and another in Houston, Mr. Netherwood spent several days here a guest of F. M. Newman, and other old-time friends.

Mr. Netherwood's primary object in calling on The Standard was to register a protest on account of not receiving his Standard regularly. He approached us very cautiously upon the subject of registering complaints, and finding that we were not averse to receiving helpful instructions, he stated that a stouter wrapper and more postage would probably assure safe delivery of the paper—and that he really appreciated and wanted the paper. The Standard editor agreed to use his best efforts to remedy the trouble, and thereby to leave no room for further complaints.

Although Mr. Netherwood will have reached the allotted "three score years and ten" early next month, he is as vigorous, alert, active and keenly interested in affairs of the day, as a man half his age.

Mr. Netherwood came to McCulloch county in 1886, making his home here for over 20 years, and holding extensive interests in the Lohn community. At the time of the building of the present court house, he was superintendent of the work, and inspected the building operations in behalf of the county. Upon removing to Galveston, he sold his farm at Lohn to Fred Tetens, and after staying over five years at Galveston, he returned to England, where he took up his residence at Bay Hall, Huddersfield. His wife died there a few years ago, and Mr. Netherwood expects to spend the remaining years of his life there.

While Mr. Netherwood has kept himself young, he was surprised to find that his old friends and acquaintances here in McCulloch too had remained young, and looked not one day older than when he last saw them. All his old friends back in England expressed surprise, when he returned there to live, that his twenty-six years' stay in the rigorous southern climate of Texas had made no greater impress upon him, but that he had maintained his youthful appearance so well. While there is a tremendous difference between the weather of Texas and the temperate climate of England, Mr. Netherwood recalls with much pleasure the many happy days spent here.

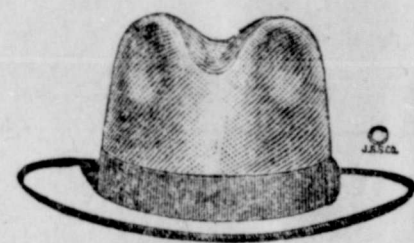
