McCULLOCH COUNTY EXHIBIT TO BE GRAND, GLORIOUS EVENT

BIG RANCH AND REALTY DEALS REPORTED HERE

Prosperity in McCulloch Land is no better evidenced than by the increasing number of sales of big ranches and realty deals of considerable magnitude consummated recently. Among other deals reported are two made by Melton & Co., which total over \$100,000 alone.

The first of these was the purchase by T. C. Ward from Mrs. W. H. Melvin of 290 acres adjoining the townsite of Melvin, the purchase price being \$70 per acre. The second deal was the sale to C. P. Gray of part of the J. H. Hill ranch, the deal totaling 4600 acres, and the sale price being \$18.00. The ranch is part of the old E. A. Davis ranch lying south of Brady. The property adjoins Mr. Gray's ranch on the east, and gives him a total of 15,000 acres in one body. Mr. Hill retained 800 acres for a stock ranch.

Dr. J. G. McCall has purchased the W. M. Capps ranch, 13 miles east of Brady on the Brownwood road, and which comprises nine sections. The ranch is well improved, with good residence windmills, tanks and is a splendid piece of property.

Lee Vaughn has purchased the Hoskins ranch in Concho county, near the town of Melvin, and will add it to his ranch, which it adjoins on the south.

Dr. McCall and Anderson have purchased the old Frisco hotel in the southeast part of Brady and will have the same moved to the lot adjoining the Brady sanitarium on the north, where the building will be converted into an annex, quarters for the nurses being provided therein, and the remainder of the fourteen rooms being given over to patients. The sanitarium for some time has been greatly in need of additional room, and this building is admirably adapted to the use to which it will be put, especially since it provides for a commodious reception and entertainment hall.

AMUSEMENT FEATURES GALORE FOR McCULLOCH CO. CO-OP'TIVE EXHIBIT

FIRST-CLASS BAND ENTIRE TWO DAYS' PROGRAM—RABBIT RACE ON SQUARE—GOAT ROPING—TEN ROUND BOXING MATCH BETWEEN HALL AND SAILOR.

The biggest event of the kind ever held in McCulloch county is the universal opinion of the McCulloch County Co-Operative Exhibit to be held in Brady Tuesday and Wednesday, October 5th and 6th. Interest everywhere is growing; splendid agricultural exhibits are promised from all sections of the county; the live stock exhibits will be among the finest ever shown in this section; the pig and hog show will attract attention from far and from near; and not least of all will be the entertainment and amusement features which will intersperse the program throughout the entire two days.

Elsewhere in this issue is a list of classifications of all the various exhibits for the guidance of both individual exhibitors and communities. The arrangement will give every class of McCulloch county product a chance to be judged entirely upon merit.

Exhibit Hall.

The E. J. Broad building, admirably adapted to the purpose by reason of the great floor space, will be used as an exhibit hall, the rear part of the building being given over to agricultural exhibits, and the front part being converted into an auditorium with seating capacity ample for all occasions. The live stock exhibits will be at the Gay wagon yard, one block east, where stalls and pens are to be had, and where the campers houses will be available to those wishing to camp here for the two days.

The Brownwood Band.

The securing of the Brownwood band for the entire two days' program is one of the best stunts accomplished by the program and entertainment committee. This band is universally accounted one of the best in the state, and is in great demand because of the class of music they are enabled to furnish. The band is comprised of 15 pieces under the leadership of an expert bandmaster from Dallas. They are coming to Brady to play, and give assurance that there will be no complaint to be made of their not playing upon every occasion and at every opportunity. They will open the two days celebration at 10:00 o'clock Tuesday morning with a concert on the public square, following which they will head the grand parade.

Grand Street Parade.

The street parade promises to be the biggest circus event of the past decade. Every effort will be made to have the parade a mile or two in length. The parade will be headed by the Brady police force, mounted on handsome white chargers, who will clear the way for the grand procession and mark the line of parade. Following will come the Brownwood band playing all the late popular military marches and airs. The city officials in silk hats and frock-tail coats will head the marchers, riding in a beautiful limousine. The school children from all over the county will march in the parade, each school marching under their own banner. In the line of parade will be the various lodges and organizations, and merchants and business men are expected to take part with decorated autos and floats.

Mule, Horse, Jack Exhibit.

The exhibit of mules, horses, jacks and ponies should be one of the biggest and strongest every held in West Texas. McCulloch county produces the finest animals in the world, and with proper interest can make an exhibition that none can surpass. Everyone having animals of this kind and class to exhibit should communicate at once with Mr. Dutton so that the arrangement committee will be

enabled to allow ample space for all stock.

Boxing Contest.

The big feature event, in the line of entertainment, will be the boxing match pulled off on the closing night of the exhibit between Alvin Hall of Rochelle and "The Sailor" of San Saba county. The match will go ten rounds. Hall is, without question, one of the cleverest and most scientific boxers in this section. He has wonderful foot work, and a punch that has aid more than one opponent out for the count. During the recent carnival in Brady, he easily won the championship from all comers. Hall and "The Sailor" matched ten rounds once before, with Hall getting the decision on points. The forthcoming bout will be an event that all sports will want to witness.

FORD REDUCES AUTO PRICES 31 PER CENT

Detroit, Sept. 21.—Henry Ford today announced a thirty-one per cent cut in the price of Ford cars, trucks and tractors. The reduction, which he declared was to pre-war levels, amounts to an average of \$130, ranging from \$95 on the truck chassis to \$180 on the Ford sedan.

"The war is over and it is time high prices were over," said Ford. "There is no sense or wisdom in trying to maintain an artificial standard of values. For the best interests of all, it is time that a real practical effort was made to bring the business of the country and the life of the country down to normal."

"There will be no change in wages," Edsel Ford, president of the Ford Motor Company, announced the following prices will apply to Ford cars and tractors:

- Stripped chassis, from \$525 to \$360.
 - Runabouts from \$550 to \$395.
 - Touring car from \$475 to \$440.
 - Truck chassis from \$640 to \$545, including demountable rims and pneumatic tires.
 - Coupe from \$850 to \$745.
 - Sedan from \$975 to \$795.

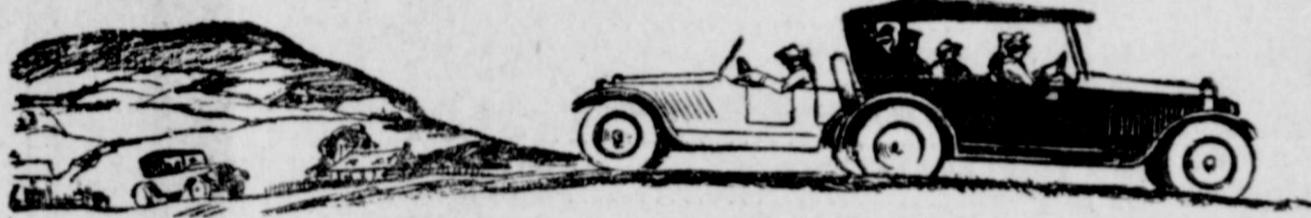

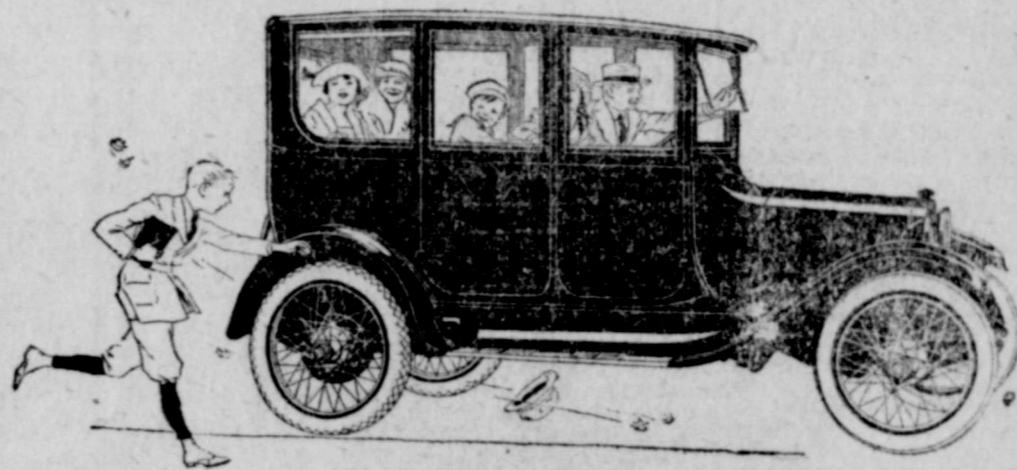

TEXAS-MEERS TO DRILL ANOTHER WELL IN CONCHO

The Texas-Meers well No. 2 on the Hargrove tract in Concho county will again be in operation the early part of next month, according to Jeff Meers, field superintendent. Mr. Meers has just secured the necessary casing for the completion of his well from the Shultz Oil Co. well No. 2. The Shultz company is now pulling the casing from this well and will plug the hole. The casing secured by Mr. Meers includes 1,000 ft. of 10-inch, 1,100 feet of 8 1-4 inch and 2,600 ft. of 6 1-4 inch casing. The Texas-Meers well has been shut down for some weeks waiting on casing, and the securing of the Schultz pipe assures early resumption of operations since the pipe will have to be moved only about 4 miles to the Meers well.

The Texas-Meers company has a 13-inch hole at a depth of 1,000 ft., and proposes to complete this well to a depth of 2,500 or 3,000 ft., unless pay sands be found at a lesser depth.

According to Mr. Meers, regardless of whether or not oil be found in Hargroves No. 2, it is his purpose to immediately after the completion of this well, begin the drilling of a test on holdings secured by him from the Shultz Oil Co. This new test will be located on acreage adjoining where oil was had in Shultz wells Nos. 1 and 2.

According to C. W. Purcell, superintendent of the Howell-Hyde well on the Matthew Capps tract, operations there are at a standstill awaiting arrival of an underreamer shipped on the 18th from Ohio. The crew has drilled 80 ft. into black shale, and have set pipe, but constant caving of the formation has necessitated underreaming before operations can be continued.

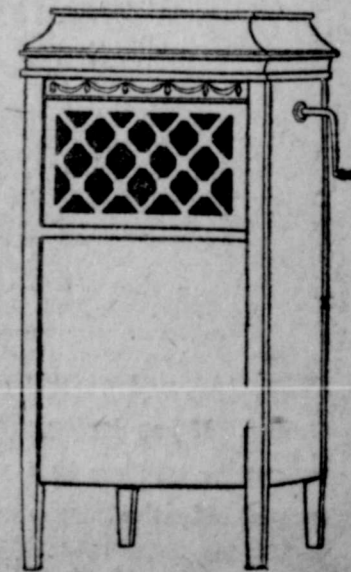

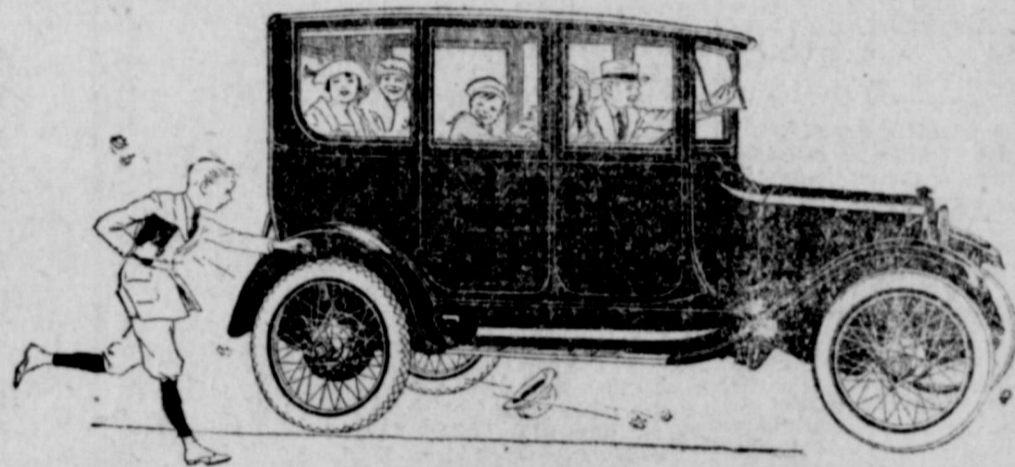

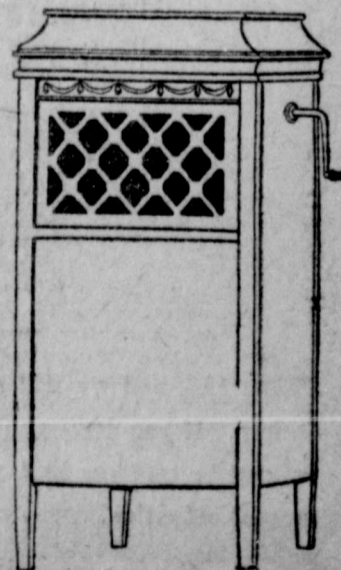
