OPENING PARADE McCULLOCH CO. CO-OPERATIVE EXHIBIT HUGE SUCCESS

FIRST COUNTY-WIDE FAIR AND EXHIBIT SURPASSES GREATEST EXPECTATIONS--IMMENSE ATTENDANCE, WONDERFUL DISPLAYS AND GREAT ENTHUSIASM.

With the great McCulloch County Co-Operative Exhibit scarcely inaugurated, unqualified success has already stamped the efforts of the promoters of this great community affair. The expectations of the most enthusiastic have already been surpassed. In point of attendance, in point of participation, in point of wonderful displays and exhibits—from whatever angle the question is viewed, the affair is crowned with the laurels of success.

A fore-runner of the first day's success was to be found in the crowds that began arriving early this morning. From all parts of the county, and from points beyond the county limits, they began arriving, and long before the opening band concert at 10:00 o'clock, the streets were packed and jammed the equal of any circus day in Brady.

The street parade was one of the most notable held here in years. Various communities were represented in clever and artistic fashion, with floats, decorated autos, and by large delegations of citizens. Many Brady business firms and individuals took part, and added to the interest of the mile-long procession. The school children from the various schools were in line, and added to the complete success of the event, while numbers of little folks, either in clown attire or in attractive vehicles added to the universal merriment and enjoyment.

Heading the parade was N. T. Cook, marshal of the day, mounted on his white charger. Assisting Mr. Cook in forming the line of parade were a

number of deputy-marshals both on horseback and on foot. Following the marshal came the Brownwood band.

Schools participating in the parade included Montgomery of Voca, Dodge, Waldrip, Lost Creek, Fife, Melvin, Calf Creek, Brady High and Brady Central. The Fife school had as its slogan, "Funny, Frisky, Frolicsome Fife," and this was prominently displayed on banners and badges of the Fife delegation. The Waldrip school was supplemented by a decorated car filled with "Sunbeams," and with some three or four cars of Waldrip enthusiasts acting as escorts. Likewise the Melvin school was accompanied by a number of cars of Melvin live wires. Calf Creek made both an interesting and comical showing, the school children being escorted by two ladies carrying a banner, and also by a number of ladies in "tacky" attire, who excited much merriment. The Brady schools had as complements, the foot ball team, agricultural club, and a bunch of children dressed in clown attire. The boy scouts and camp fire girls were also numbered

among the organizations taking part. The Brady Fire department mounted on their big fire truck, were among the paraders.

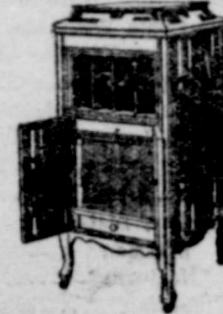

BILL LEVIES POLL TAX ON WOMEN SAME AS ON MEN

Austin, Texas, Oct. 1.—The conference on the election bill reached a complete agreement tonight and expect to report the conference bill to the Legislature tomorrow. The new bill is entirely different in the essential issues from the bills which were sent to the committee in that it admits men to the November polls on the same equality with women and imposes a poll tax of \$1.75 on both men and women to vote at any election before Feb. 1, 1921, and requires that the tax be paid between Oct. 6 and 22.

In specific language the bill levies a poll tax on women for next year and stipulates that it must be paid before Feb. 1, 1921, the same final date that applies to men. It further amends the general statutes so as to eliminate the word "male," and substitutes the word "persons," so that the election laws will apply to persons, male and female, who are eligible to vote in this State.

It was Representative Barroch of Mills county who persuaded the committee to place men on the same plane with women in the emergency situation. He contended that to do otherwise would be an illegal discrimination which might vitiate the Texas election law and rob Texas of representation in the electoral college as well as jeopardize Democratic Congressmen who might have close races, and give Republican opponents opportunity to bring contests before a National Republican House with chances of being seated.

The bills which went to conference recognized only women to qualify for the November election, refusing to permit men who were liable for poll tax on Jan. 1, 1920, to pay it now, and also contemplated that women should only obtain exemption certificates and without the payment of any fee.

TEXAS CENSUS, 4,661,270—GAIN MAINTAINS PLACE AS FIFTH STATE

GAIN OVER 1910 CENSUS IS 19 PER CENT—INCREASE TOTALS 764,485—EIGHTY RURAL COUNTIES LOSE IN POPULATION RESULT OF PROLONGED DROUGHT.

Washington, Oct. 4.—The 1920 census of Texas is 4,661,027, the Census Bureau announced today. The State's numerical increase over the 1910 count is 764,485, or 19.6 per cent. Indications were that the State's relative position would not be changed when final results of the country's census are announced. Texas stands fifth, New York, Illinois, Ohio and Pennsylvania ranking her in number of inhabitants.

Loss of population in more than eighty rural counties in Texas prevented the Lone Star State from going into the 5,000,000 class this year.

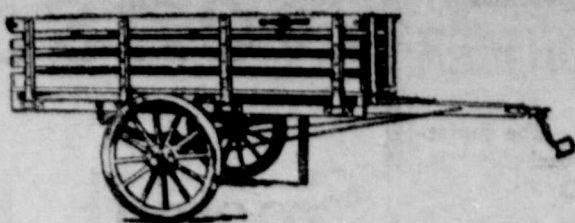
