Denton, Texas, Oct. 12--The friends of Miss Melba Aschbacher of Brady, Texas, a senior student in the College of Industrial Arts, will be glad to know that she was the winner of a scholarship in voice in the recent contest held in the auditorium of the College. The following five members of the music faculty acted judges in this contest: Mr. Harry E. Schultz, Miss Katherine Bailey, Mrs. Hazel D. Gronet, Miss Selma E. Tietze, and Miss Mildred Holloway. Following the try-outs each judge, without any discussion of the contestants, voted by sealed ballot. Miss Aschbacher received four votes of the five votes cast. Miss Aschbacher has been a student in the College of Industrial Arts for the past three years, and has made a splendid record. At the close of this, her fourth year, she will receive the degree of Bachelor of Science.

The College maintains a large and well-equipped department of music. The music faculty consists of ten piano teachers, five voice teachers, two violin teachers, a teacher of public school music, and a teacher of orchestral instruments. The only point remaining to make the great McCulloch County Co-Operative Exhibit a grand success has been accomplished. The financial end of the big show has been put "over the top." So signal has been the success of the committee in financing the exhibit, that they are happy to announce the doubling of all prize awards for community exhibits. Instead of first prize being \$50, the award has been placed at \$100, and Waldrip community captures this handsome purse. Second prize is \$90, instead of the \$45 offered, and goes to Fife. So on down through the entire list of ten community prizes, the tenth award having been made \$10 instead of \$5.00 offered.

The fact that the finance committee was enabled to meet all bills and expenses, and still have a sufficient sum left on hand for the distribution of these handsome prizes is due to last-minute contributions upon the part of numbers of individuals, as well as the doubling of original subscriptions by others. Another thing that materially swelled the treasury fund was the \$200 subscription given towards the exhibit by the Brady Chamber of Commerce, and which was used to defray the expenses of the club boys to the Dallas fair. Still another source of income was in the sale of privileges.

FATHER KILLS SON NEAR PAINT ROCK--QUARREL OVER CROPS

Ballinger, Tex., Oct. 7.--W. H. Martin, 45, a farmer, was in jail here today, charged with killing his son, W. T. Martin, 23, near Paint Rock, yesterday.

County officers said trouble arose between the father and son over division of a crop they were working on shares. The young man, according to the officers, started at his father with a shot gun and the latter, using a revolver, shot the son four times, two bullets entering the back and passing through the stomach.

Martin was led from jail today to a truck standing in the streets in which the remains of his son were being carried to the depot for shipment to Yeakum for burial. He gazed for a few seconds at his son's body and returned to his cell without making any comment.

The quarrel is said to have started at the dinner table after the son had returned from marketing some cotton and the killing followed in the presence of the mother and six children, the youngest two years old. Deceased was single and made his home with his father and was making a crop on the halves.

The family came here from Lavaca county last fall to pick cotton and decided to remain here and rent land. Their home is in Concho county, south of here. A 19-year-old sister accompanied the body to Yeakum for burial.

Death of Dewey Kirby.
The death of Dewey Kirby occurred at 5:00 o'clock last Thursday evening at the home of his brother, Mark Kirby, following a brief illness. The boy was 17 years old at the time of his death. His father is living in Oklahoma City, being a member of the police force there, but the boy had been making his home in Brady with his brother for some time. Funeral services were held here, and interment made in the Brady cemetery.

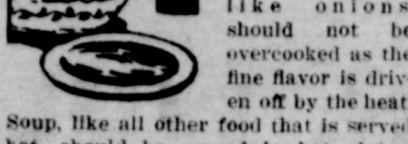

A soup pot may take a spoonful of peas, a half cupful of tomato, a stalk of celery, an onion or a bit of beef gravy.

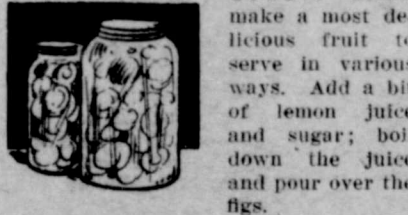
A Norwegian Fried Cake.—Beat two eggs until light, add a tablespoonful of sugar and three tablespoonfuls of cream.
