OAK CREEK PROJECT FEASIBLE

The end of Mr. Clark's visit here was to view the Oak Creek situation with reference to the proposed irrigation project which several citizens have been discussing lately.

Mr. Clark reported that he was pleased with every feature of the proposed project. He said the location of the dam was ideal and the lay of the land that was to be irrigated could not be excelled. He also stated that the valley land that would be subject to irrigation under the proposed dam was as rich as could be found anywhere.

Mr. Clark was not only looking over the Oak Creek project but was also looking out for suitable locations for irrigation dam generally. There is no question about it, Texas will eventually be a net work of irrigation systems.

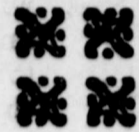
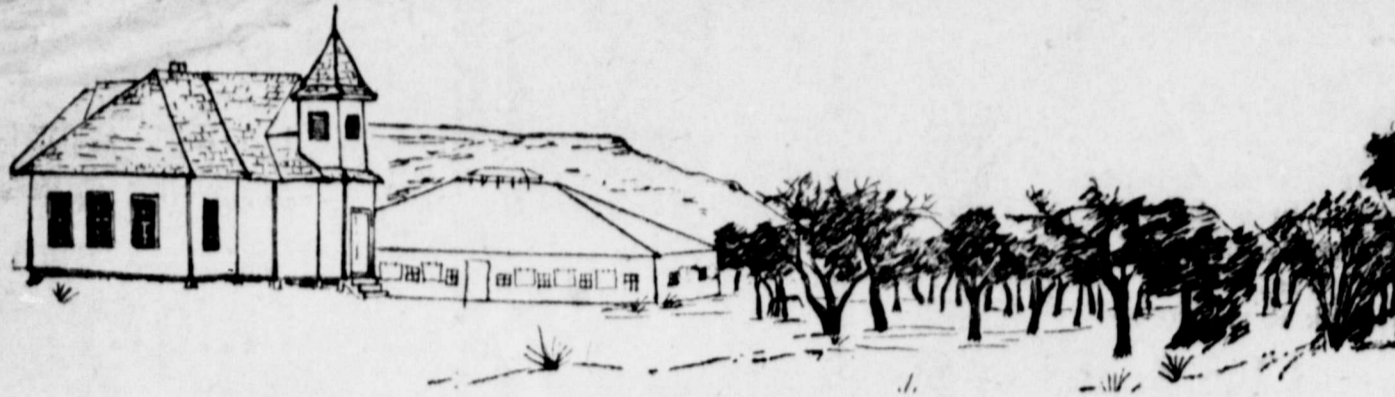

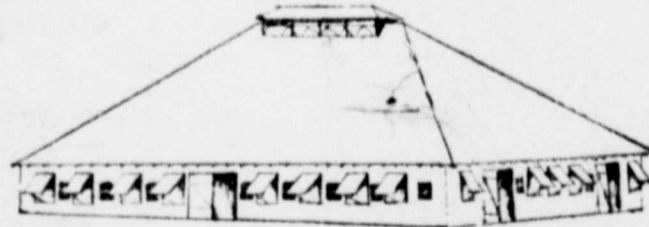
No Admission Fee

The State of Texas.

Notice is hereby given, to whom concerned, that The City of Bronte, Texas, the post office address of Bronte, Texas, did on

the 13th day of May, A. D. 1925, file its application in the office of the Board of Water Engineers for the State of Texas, in which it applies for a permit to appropriate of the unappropriated waters of the State, from the Red Hollow Creek, a tributary of the East Kickapoo creek, same being a tributary of the Colorado River, in Coke County, Texas, to supply water for a municipal water supply, not to exceed 141 acre-feet per annum, to be impounded in a reservoir, and diverted by means of a pumping plant, said dam to be located at a point which bears N. 82 degrees E 410-feet from the NE corner of Com. Ry. Co survey No. 1, across the said Red Hollow, in Coke County, Texas, and is distant in a southeasterly direction from Bronte, Texas, 1 1-2 miles.

You are hereby further notified that the said city of Bronte proposes to construct a dam in and across the said Red Hollow, in Coke County, Texas, to be of clay, 25 feet in height, 600 feet in length, having a top width of 10 feet, and a bottom width of 122 feet, thus creating a reservoir having an average width of 303 feet, length of impounded water 2,000 feet, average depth of stored water 10 feet, and having a storage capacity of 141 acre-feet, and to impound therein, and divert therefrom not to exceed 141 acre feet of water per annum.

A hearing on the application of the said City of Bronte, will be held by the Board of Water Engineers for the State of Texas, in the office of the board at Austin, Texas, on Monday, June 29, A. D. 1925, beginning at ten o'clock a. m., at which time and place all parties interested may appear and be heard. Such hearing will be continued from time to time, and from place to place, if necessary, until such determination has been made relative to
