
Jim Bob Arrott to Wed Jane Nobles in August



OF BRONTE, COKE COUNTY, TEX-AS, PRESCRIBING FLOOD HAZ-ARD AREA MAPS AS PREPARED BY FEDERAL INSURANCE AD-MINISTRATION TO BE THE CON-TROLLING MAPS FOR THE PUR-POSE OF THIS ORDINANCE; PRE-SCRIBING SUBDIVISION REGULA-TIONS FOR MINIMUM ELEVA-TIONS ABOVE MEAN SEA LEVEL TOFFIRST FLOOR LEVELS IN THE CITY OF BRONTE; PRESCRIBING PERMITS TO BE ISSUED ONLY ON PROOF OF ACCEPTABLE EL-EVATIONS; PRESCRIBING STAND-DARDS OF BUILDING OF NEW CONSTRUCTION AND IMPROVE-EXISTING STRUC-MENT OF TURES: PROVISIONS FOR FLOOD-WAY: DISCLAIMER OF LIABILI-TY: PROVIDING FOR APPEAL; PROVIDING PENALTY: AND PRO-VIDING SEVERABILITY CLAUSE

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT OR-DAINED BY THE CITY CCUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRONTE, COKE COUNTY, TEXAS:

SECTION ONE (1):

This ordinance supplements the ordinance of the City relating to subdivisions, building, inspections and issuance of building permits.

SECTION TWO (2):

Flood Hazard Area Identification Maps, Official Number H 48 081 0900 01, officially issued the 29th day of March, 1974, mean sea level (msl) water-surface elevations of a flood with one percent chance of occurring during any year, either shown on been granted by the city following mize or eliminate infiltration of flood hazard area maps, or as otherwise provided, and floodwoy data to establish limits of encroachment of floodblow restricting development, as provided by the Federal Insurance Administration (FIA) shall be controlling in administration of this ordinance. Both maps and data, by reference, are made a part of this ordinance. Revisions of maps and data, issued officially by FIA, shall automatically replace prior issuances. All official maps with controlling elevation and floodway data, after issuance, are available for public inspection at the City Hall of the City of Bronte, 114 South Washington, Coke County, Texas.

Approval shall indicate that the requirements of this ordinance have been met unless, for supportable reasons, exceptions have been granted by the city following appeal and adjustment procedures provided herein.
