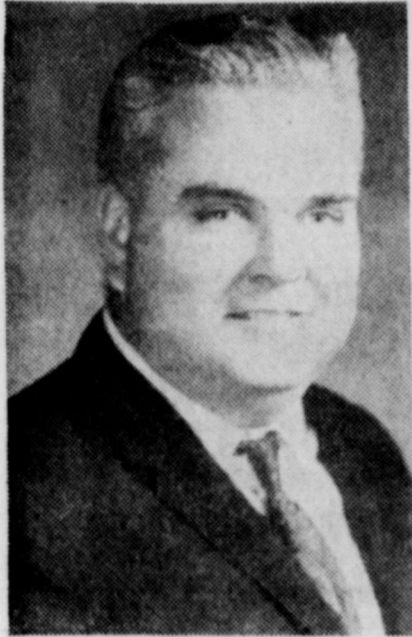

Dr. Wm. A. Riley, rheumatologist at Malone and Hogan Clinic of Big Spring, and Mrs. Savannah Belcher, a Bronte native and chapter representative of Odessa, will be on the program when the West Texas

Arthritis Foundation holds a Public Forum in the Robert Lee School auditorium Aug. 21 at 7:30 p.m.

Physical Therapist Kirby Horton, who is with the Dora Roberts Rehabilitation Center in Big Spring, will also be one of the speakers.

Sponsored by the Coke County Family Living Committee and HD Council, the program is under the direction of the West Texas Chapter of the Arthritis Foundation and literature and displays will be provided by the chapter.

The program is open to the public and all interested persons are urged to attend.

## City Council Votes to Collect Delinquent Taxes

Bronte Mayor R. T. Caperton has informed The Bronte Enterprise that the Bronte City Council voted unanimously at their last regular meet-

ing to file suit for all delinquent city ad valorem taxes. The council entered into a contract with Coke County and Bronte City Attorney Robert E. Owen to represent the city in these collection procedures.

Mayor Caperton stated that the preparatory work for these suits is already in progress at City Hall and he anticipates that the first suits will be filed with the court in mid-Sep-

tember. The mayor emphasized that suits will be filed to collect all delinquent ad valorem taxes, regardless of who the delinquent taxpayer is or how large or small the amount of delinquent taxes may be.

"Each member of the City Council regrets that this action has become necessary," said Mayor Caperton. He continued, "It is unfair to those good citizens who regularly pay their taxes on time, however, to allow certain property owners to continue to ignore their obligations in this area."

"I hope many of the people who have, for one reason or another, overlooked or failed to pay these taxes in the past will take advantage of the time period between now and when the suits are filed to pay their delinquent taxes. By doing so they will be able to save themselves embarrassment and additional expense of a lawsuit," the mayor added.

## COURT SESSION IS CALLED OFF

This newspaper was advised Wednesday that the petit jury panel which had been called for duty Monday will not have to report. The office of Sheriff J. Lee Ensor said Judge Earl Smith had called and cancelled the session of 51st District Court. Cases which scheduled were passed over or postponed for one reason or another.

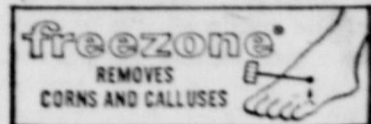

FISHING NEWS

It's been many moons since we've had this kind of crappie fishing at Oak Creek Lake. With the hot weather, and the water temperature rather high, we've been expecting the crappie to slow down, but it seems to get better.

The average size of the fish is getting bigger, with most of the larger fish being caught at night. There is not any place you can go after dark, and not see lights on a dock or boat. The fish are being taken in all areas of the lake. All that needs to be done is a little shopping around to find your own spot. Fishermen that do are catching larger fish than the ones that are doing all their fishing in the baited holes.

The bass are something else. It's strange that one fish will hit so well and another be as slow as the bass are right now. I've asked a lot of bass fishermen what they think is wrong and usually get a lot of different answers.

I believe the main problem is we have far too much foliage, and when a fish can take its fill in a short period of time, it's difficult to put many fish on a stringer. Outside of a period from around 8:30 until dark, the bass fishermen's average per hour of fishing looks like a Houston Astro batting average.

The channel cat are biting about average for this time of year. Some nice strings were caught on trotlines, and rod and reel. With some cooler weather, we expect to see some fine channel cat fished here at Oak Creek.

Just a few of the big strings of crappie caught over the weekend: Mr. and Mrs. Buckie Shivers and Mr. and Mrs. Gill Shivers of Odessa, 150 plus. Mr. and Mrs. J. C. Luttrell of Sonora, 50 plus. People were here from New Mexico, the South Plains and other areas, and took home a lot of fish. It's one of the times we've hoped would come, when everybody that half tries catches a lot of nice fish.
