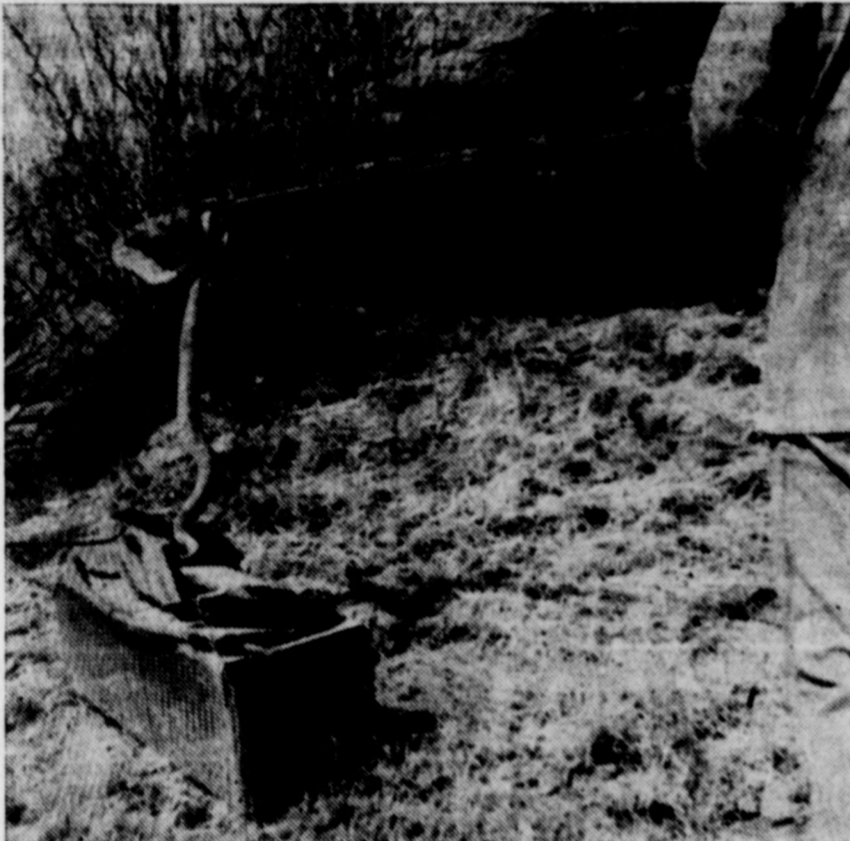

## LOCAL TRACKMEN TAKE 3RD PLACE

The Bronte Longhorn trackmen placed third in a track meet held last Thursday in Santa Anna. The local team scored 47 points behind Cherokee's 67 and Roscoe's 55. This was the first meet of the year for the Horns. Thirty-five teams were entered in the meet.

The two relay teams picked up most of Bronte's points with the 440 relay team finishing third and the mile relay team second. The sprint relay team had a time of 46.2 with Robert Ball, Wayne Coalson, Nelson Coulter and Turney Coulter making up the team. T. Coulter, Paul Cervenka, Coalson and N. Coulter made up the mile relay team and had a time of 3:42.5.

Other points were picked up by N. Coulter in the 330 yard intermediate hurdles where he finished second with a time of 44.5 and third in the pole vault with 11 feet; Mario Gonzales was third in discus with a throw of 115' 2"; Bobby Hamilton was sixth in the 880 with 2:14.5; Paul Cervenka came in sixth in the 440 yard dash in 55.5.

## CLAUS H. ROHLFS TO PREACH HERE

Rev. Claus H. Rohlfs, Professor Church Administration at Perkins School of Theology, Southern Methodist University in Dallas, will be the guest preacher for the morning worship service of First United Methodist Church at Bronte Sunday, March 14, the pastor, Rev. C. Earle Lewis, reports.

Rev. Rohlfs, in addition to being professor of the seminary, also holds the administrative posts of Director of the Intern Program and Field Education and Director of the Courses of Study School.

Born in Innien, Schleswig-Holstein, West Germany, Rev. Rohlfs came to the United States with his family in 1931. He served in the Pacific Theater with the United States Army during World War II.

Rev. Rohlfs has served a number of churches over the United States prior to his appointment to Perkins. He was also district superintendent of the San Angelo District, and was a member of the City Council of San Antonio in 1961-63, the first minister ever elected to such a post in that city.
