### SHERRIE COALSON SIGNS INTENT TO PLAY WITH WAYLAND (From Plainview Daily Herald)

Sherrie Coalson, a high scoring forward from Bronte, has become the fourth player to sign a letter of intent to play in the Wayland women's basketball program next year.

The 5-8 Miss Coalson scored 3,563 points for the Class B school and was a three-time all district selection as well as gaining regional honors.

Through her career, she averaged 24.6 points a game, hitting 48 per cent from the field and 75 per cent from the line.

As a senior, she averaged 28 points in non-district but hiked that to 35 points per outing in league play and tallied an average of 33 points in regionals. She sank 68 per cent of her shots from the field and 78 per cent from the line and averaged five rebounds a game in 1975-76.

"I was real impressed by her quickness and her shooting ability. She has real good potential as a guard," said Coach Dean Weese. "She definitely wanted to play for Wayland and I like that, too."

Other signees are Kathy Hars-ton of Southlake Carroll, Jill Rankin of Phillips and Jackie Carthel of Lockney.

Miss Coalson is the daughter of Mrs. Charlotte Coalson of Bronte and the late Delbert Roy Coalson.

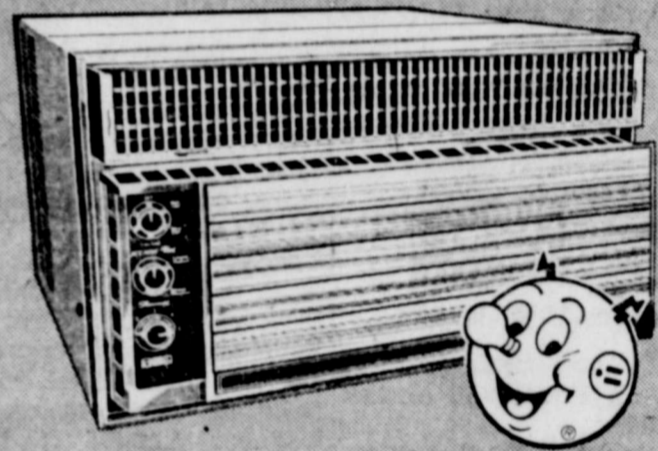

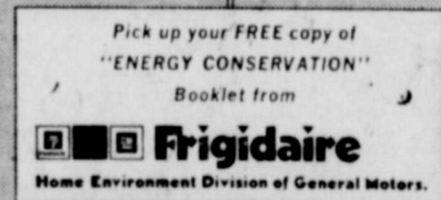
