Cattle Smuggling. SAN ANTONIO, Tex., April 15 .- The federal authorities here yesterday or-dered the seizure of 1700 head of cattle which, it is alleged, have recently been smuggled across the Rio Grande from Mexico. The principal sufferers by these sn ling operations are G. W. Simmon. Co., who have a ranch in Mexico, just across from Pecos county, Texas. It is alleged that one J. H. Reagan two years ago located on the Texas sida, just opposite the ranch of Simmons, and registered the same brand as that used by Simmons in Mexico. Lately 1700 hundred head of 4-year-old cattle in the Simmons brand were found in Reagan's possession. Reagan was arrested for smuggling and waived examination and the cattle have been ordered seized by the customs officials. The McCor mick ranch in Mexico has also sustained losses in a similar manner, forty head of cattle being found recently in the possession of a neighbor on the American side named Ramsey.
