ELECTION NOTICE

It was moved by D. A. Harris and seconded by Alderman W. H. Golemon, that there be submitted to the qualified voters of the City of Brackettville, Texas, who are property taxpayers, the following propositions:

For the issuance of the bonds of the said City in the sum of Twenty Thousand and no/100 (\$20,000.00) Dollars, for the purpose of water main extension and fire protection of the said City of Brackettville, Texas, bearing interest not to exceed Five (5%) per cent per annum, which election is to be held on the 24th day of September, 1938.

The motion was carried by the following vote: Alderman Allen Williams, D. A. Harris, Clarence Stratton, W. H. Golemon and Harold N. Bitter voting "Aye", none voting "Nay".

Thereupon, the following ordinance was adopted:

"An ordinance authorizing an election for the purpose of submitting a proposition for the issuance of extension of water main and fire protection bonds of the City of Brackettville, Texas, and to pledge, appropriate, and mortgage out of the net revenues of the City of Brackettville, Texas, waterworks system sufficient sum to pay interest and create a sinking fund to pay the principal of said bonds at maturity."

Therefore, be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Brackettville, Texas, that an election be held on the 24th day of September, 1938, at which election the following proposition shall be submitted: "Shall the City Council of the City of Brackettville, Texas, be authorized to issue bonds of the City of Brackettville, Texas, in the sum of Twenty Thousand and no/100 (\$20,000.00) Dollars to mature serially, not to exceed Twenty (20) years from their date, bearing interest not to exceed Five

(5%) per cent per annum. For the purpose of Extension of water mains and fire protection, under and by virtue of the Constitution and the laws of the State of Texas, including Articles Nos. 1111, 1112, and 1114 Vernon's Annotated Civil Statutes of the State of Texas, as amended by the Acts of 1933, 43rd Legislature, page 320, Chapter 122, and pledge, appropriate, and mortgage out of the net revenues of the City of Brackettville, Waterworks system sufficient sum to pay interest and create a sinking fund to pay principal of the said bonds at maturity, as authorized by the Constitution and the laws of the State of Texas.

Said election shall be held at the City Hall in the City of Brackettville, Texas, and the following are hereby appointed as officers of said election, to-wit: Ben H. Nolan and J. F. Nance.

Said election shall be held under the provisions of Chapter One (1) Title Twenty-two (22), Revised Civil Statutes, 1925, and only qualified voters, who are property taxpayers of the said City of Brackettville, Texas, shall be allowed to vote.

All voters desiring to support the proposition to issue said bonds shall have written or printed on their ballots the words, "For The Issuance of Water Main Extension And Fire Protection Bonds." And those opposed shall have written or printed on their ballots the words, "Against The Issuance of Water Main Extension And Fire Protection Bonds."

The manner of holding said election shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas regulating general elections.

A copy of this ordinance signed by the Mayor and attested by the City Clerk of the said City of Brackettville, Texas, shall serve as a proper notice of said election.

The Mayor is authorized and directed to cause said notice of bond election to be published in the Brackett News-

Mail, a newspaper of general circulation, published in the said City, and by posting said notice in three public places in the City of Brackettville, which said notice shall be published and posted once a week for two consecutive weeks prior to the time of holding said election, the date of the first publication to be at least fourteen (14) days prior to the date of holding said election.
