# The Gordon Spot

Peanut harvest is in full swing in Eastland County. You can find combines running in any of our peanut growing communities. Yields are not real high, but some farmers are reporting good crops. Most of them say yields will not be as high as 1968 or 1966. Late peanuts may be the best ones this year — that is if we have a killing frost. Good rains in September will help late crops. The corn stalk borer activity also declined during the month.

I don't think you will see many peanut trailers and trucks lined up at the buying stations waiting to be loaded this year. One reason — most of the buying stations have increased their buying capacity during the last few years. Also, more farmers are getting their own trailers. D. B. Warren and his sons Wesley and Jerry of Seaman were installing a new trailer the other day. They will be able to dry as many as six loads at one time.

When wet peanuts wait in trailers for days to be dried, quality goes down.

scientists and chemical representatives to Desdemona to see one of our peanut demonstrations. They looked at a leaf-spot demonstration on R. L. Lewis' place. The peanuts are farmed by his two sons, R. M. Lewis and Wesley.

We have sprayed the peanuts four times using twelve different fungicides. When the peanuts are harvested, we will find out how much good the fungicides did.

Recent rains in Eastland County have improved the chances for the success of a fall garden. Many tasty vegetables actually grow better in cooler temperatures.

Cabbage, broccoli, carrots, cauliflower, turnips, mustard, spinach, beans and squash and even tomatoes do well under fall weather conditions.

Onions can be produced from seed that were planted in Sept. or early Oct. Those thinned out can be used in the green stage.

I'm sure you have already read that Bob Cohen has resigned as Assistant County Agent to return to school. He plans to complete his work for a Masters degree. Bob served in this county for three years. We will miss him. Until a replacement is assigned, I will be working with the 4-H organizations as well as with the adults.

I know Bob will do well in school, and we wish him and his wife, Jane, the best in the future.

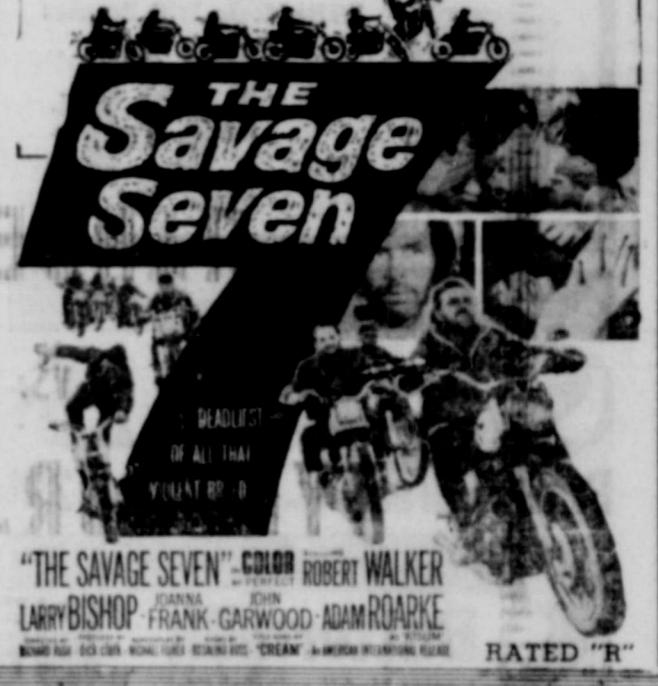

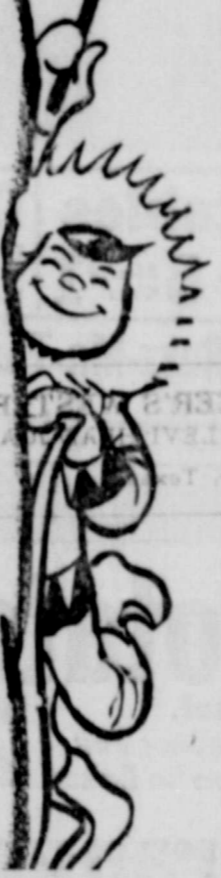
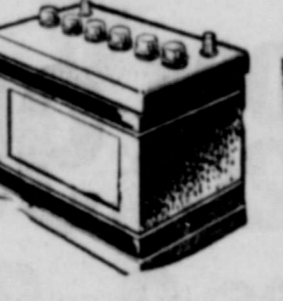
