



### WHAT ABOUT --?

There is much-to-do made about "salvation by faith ONLY" in the world today. Men teaching that there is nothing for man to do but believe in order to be saved have arisen all about us in the religious world. If there is nothing for man to do except to "believe ONLY," what about Acts 2:40, "And with many other words did he testify and exhort, saying. Save yourselves from this untoward generation?" If man is saved the moment he believes what about Acts 22:16? Saul had already believed on the Lord and had spent three days in repentance and prayer; and yet when Ananias came to him he said, "Why tarriest thou? Arise, and be baptized, and WASH AWAY THY SINS, calling on the name of the Lord." If Saul had already been saved from sin when he believed, why do something to wash away his sins? If faith only is enough to save a person what about James 2:17, "Even so faith, if it hath not works is dead, being alone." James clearly states that faith only is not enough to save a man because it is a dead faith if it is alone: i. e., without works. If nothing more is needed to save a man than "faith only," what about James 2:24, "Ye see then how that by works a man is justified, and not by FAITH ONLY." Friend, how can you stand in the face of all of these and still say that a man is justified by FAITH ONLY? You, no doubt, have heard some preacher try to explain away the meanings of these and other scriptures that teach that man must have an obedient faith. If these plain scriptures must be "explained away" in order for the teachings of men to stand it is not clear that the men that teach such things are teaching a "salvation" that is not in harmony with God's word?

Unless the above scriptures are "explained away" they stand in direct opposition to the doctrine of salvation by "faith only." Can we not understand that ALL scriptures must be interpreted in such a way that they will harmonize? We know that the word of God teaches us that we are saved by faith. (The churches of Christ do not deny that man is saved by faith.) But let us hear the scriptures as they tell us how man is saved by faith. Galations 5:6, "For in Jesus Christ neither circumcision availeth any thing, nor uncircumcision; but FAITH WHICH WORKETH BY LOVE." If you believe that you were saved by faith only, what about the above? We read in I Cor. 7:19 a parallel passage with Galations 5:6, "Circumcision is nothing, and uncircumcision is nothing, but the KEEPING OF THE COMMANDMENTS OF GOD." How about your faith? Was it a faith that was dead (faith only, Ja. 2:17, 24)? Was your faith one that worked, i. e., led you to repentance, to confess Christ and be baptized for the remission of your
