Postmaster Imogene Holt be-Rieves that with a three-cent stamp your Christmas cards will win more friends and influence more people than if they are mailed with a two-cent stamp.

"First-class postage," she explained today, "is the best Yule-Tide insurance you can get. With it your greetings will be processed and delivered quicker. And they'll be forwarded, or returned. if it becomes necessary.

"This eliminates any worry about whether or not your season's greetings were received. Your own return address on the envelope will help others keep their address books up to date. Then, too, Christmas cards sent with three-cent stamps may carry written messages, a custom everyone enjoys."

None of these postal privileges are authorized at the third-class rates. Moreover, Christmas card envelopes smaller than 2% "x4" or larger than 9"x12" require canrellation by hand, and must warry first-class postage.

Everyone is urged to tie their Christmas cards in two seperate bundles, with each address facthe postal labels marked "All For Local Delivery" and "All For Out-Of Town Delivery." These will shorten delivery time great-
