

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

Section 1. That Article IX of the Constitution of the State of Texas be, and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto another section to be designated as Section 5, which shall read as follows:

"Section 6 (a) The Legislature may by law authorize the creation of two hospital districts, one to be coextensive with and have the same boundaries as the incorporated City of Amarillo, as such boundaries now exist or as they may hereafter be lawfully extended, and the other to be soextensive with Wichita County.

"If such district or districts are created, they may be authorised to lary a tax not to exceed 5eventy-five Cents (154) on the One Hundred Dollars (100.00) valuation of taxable property within the district and the county shall not thereafter levy taxes (other than hereis provided) for hospital purposes now for providing hospital care for accept individuals of the county.

"If such district provided, however, so tax may be levied until approved by a majority vote of the participating resident qualified property taxpaying voters who have duly rendered their property for taxation. The maximum rate of tax may be changed at subsequent elections so long as obligations are not impaired, and not to exceed the maximum limit of Seventy-five Cents (754) per One Hundred Dollars (100.00) valuation, and no election ehall be required by subsequent changes in the boundaries of the City of Amarillo.


