Firemen Urge Contributions For Resuscitator

'\$605 Artificial Respirator Could Save Many Lives'

Dimmitt's Volunteer Firemer nnounced this week they were maugurating a drive to obtain a portable resuscitator for use in the city and county.

This machine fulfills the same functions as a respirator and works from bottled oxygen. No larger than a suitcase, the resuscitator actually has brought people back to life after they have been declared dead.

It is a "miracle" worker when accidents causing breathing failure occur - accidents such as drowning, electric shock, smoke suffocation, gas poisoning, or plain shock from an automobile accident. And it works as well if a patient is struggling to breathe after a heart attack or a bad spell of asthma.

Use of the machine is so simple a child could save a life with it, says the manufacturer.

Total cost of the machine with everything is \$605 and will have to be raised through donations, according to Fireman J. B. Moore.

ment. In counties or other subdivisions using voting machines the above provision for voting for and against this Constitutional Amendment shall be placed on said machines in such manner that each voter shall vote on the machine for or against the Constitutional Amendment.

Sec. 3. The Governor of the State of Texas shall issue the necessary proclamation for said election and have the same published as required by the Constitution and laws of this State.






